What's Going On in 4th Grade. . .

4th Grade-Welcome to 4th Grade!

At Westbrooke all 4th grade teachers use a class management system called "Classroom Dojo". Through classroom DoJo, parents can have real-time updates about positives and concerns that may be happening during the school day. Every student was sent home with instructions for parents on how to sign up for classroom Dojo. It's an easy (3) step process. You can choose to receive notifications through cell phone text or emails. Please contact your child's teacher or our school's Parent Engager, Mrs. Woodard, if you still need your instructions. We encourage ALL 4th grade parents to sign-up.

4th graders will begin the month of September diving into 4th grade standards. In Math students will continue to work on place value up to

1,000,000, comparing numbers, adding and subtracting whole numbers and rounding. In science, we have been working on the scientific method and are beginning to learn a bout changes to the Earth's surface. In ELA/SS students are working on a

Thematic Unit of Equal Rights, story elements, summarizing/main idea, reading and understanding maps and Primary/Secondary sources. Feel free to begin conversations with your 4th grader on various topics such as Civil Rights Movement, Native Americans Equal Rights or possibly brainstorm with your 4th grader about what is means to have equal rights currently in America.

What's Going On in 5th Grade. .

<u>Sth Grade</u> Our academic focus 1st quarter in Language Arts is the literary strand. We are making inferences, citing textual evidence and learning vocabulary through context clues. We also will be starting to read some short stories and novels. In Science, students are beginning a unit on ecosystems. Students will learn how plants and animals use energy. In Math, we will be focusing on place value with whole numbers and decimals, adding and subtracting decimals, multiplying decimals by powers of ten and exponents and

multiplication and division of whole numbers. In Social Studies, students are working on geography with our focus being the Western Hemisphere, learning about the different ways to use maps and

globes, and trying to understand that culture is created based on where people live.

We are also very excited about our upcoming 5th Grade trip to Camp Kern. We will enjoy outdoor education at camp for three days and two nights.

Our trip is scheduled for Sept 26-28, 2018.

There was a mandatory parent meeting for parents of 5th graders who wanted to attend Camp Kern. That meeting was held on Tuesday, August 28th. If you were unable to attend that meeting and your student wants to go on the trip you are asked to contact your child's homeroom teacher because there was important information and guidelines shared at the meeting that all parents must be aware of. **Deadline for money is 9/18**.

Student Attendance Is Important at WBV

It is important for your child to come to school every day. If he/she is unable to come, due to illness or a family emergency, please send a note to school with the child when he/she returns so we can make the absence excused. If we do not receive a note, the absence is considered unexcused.

It is also important to get to school ON TIME. School starts at 9:20 AM. Your child should be in his/her classroom by this time. If your child is reporting to

school after the tardy bell without a note signed by the parent / legal guardian then he/she is considered to have an unexcused TARDY. If your child is absent/tardy because of an appointment – please bring a note from the physician's office.

The end of the students' day at WBV is 3:20 PM. If you need to occasionally pick your child up early then please either have a note or be able to explain

the special circumstances that requires your child to leave early on that particular day.

A Message from the School Counselor—Tips To Begin Start a Great School Year

September is here and the start of a new school year has began. Many families find this exciting while others dread it, in anticipation of homework, early mornings, and school stress. I believe that all parents want their children to have a successful school year. The staff at Westbrooke want that same success. This year we will continue to hold *HIGH behavior expectations* throughout the school. We are using a proactive model that teaches the behaviors, reinforces and recognizes students who are able to model these behaviors and has systems in place to support students who have a difficult time or may present more challenging behaviors. We have a school-wide discipline plan that addresses the entire school, the classroom, and areas outside of the classroom (such as hallways, restrooms, offices, cafeteria, and playground). Every person who works in the school is aware of the behavior expectations and works to ensure the students are consistently getting the same message. Our emphasis first quarter is to make sure students understand our rules, procedures and routines and are able to be the best student they can be and learn as much as possible.


