

Student Attendance Is Important at WBV—Nifty Fifty!!

It is important for your child to come to school every day. If he/she is unable to come, due to illness or a family emergency, please send a note to school with the child when he/she returns so we can make the absence excused. If we do not receive a note, the absence is considered unexcused.

"Restorative Practice Corner" Restorative Talking Circles

Talking Circles are an important restorative practice that can be used both at school and at home with families. They can be used both proactively to strengthen relationships and responsively to address harm that has occurred. The format for a talking circle usually consists of:

- 1. <u>Statement of the circle's purpose:</u> This establishes a positive tone and direction for the discussion that will take place in the circle. 2. <u>Discussion of ground rules:</u> Tell your truth, listen empathetically, & respect the talking piece are examples of basic guidelines to follow.
- 3. Introduction of talking piece: This can be any item passed around during a talking circle to denote someone's turn to speak 4. Discussion rounds: These are circle "go-arounds" where a specific question gets posed at the beginning of each round for each participant to answer when they receive the talking piece, if they choose to. 5. Circle closing: This can be a final thought, reflection question, or poem to bring closure and acknowledge the work done in the circle.

If a talking circle is being used to respond to an event that has harmed the relationships either in the classroom or home, the following restorative questions can be used during the discussion rounds: What happened? What were you thinking about at the time? What have you thought about since the incident? Who do you think has been affected by the incident? Who do you think has been affected by your actions? How have you been affected? What do you think you need to do to make things right?
