R.C.3313.843(F) Listing of Services and Costs**

The Northwest Ohio ESC provides many services for our member school districts and surrounding districts when possible and appropriate.

1. Services offered at no cost for member districts include:

- Recruitment and approval of substitute teachers and paraprofessionals for member districts
- Assistance with teacher licensure
- Parent mentor services
- Home school application processing
- Bus/van driver approvals
- Consortium services for LEP, IDEA-B, and ECSE grants
- PAX Good Behavior training and support
- Crisis Prevention Intervention (CPI) training
- Business Advisory Council regional operation
- Summer Honors Academy
- Annual fall administrator conference and legal update
- Professional development for teachers, administrators and other school staff see [www.nwoesc.org/professional-development](http://www.nwoesc.org/professional-development)
- Leadership Academy for board members and district administrators
- Coordination of quiz bowls/leagues/tournaments, music festival, spelling bees, other events as requested by member districts
- Hosting of professional meetings for superintendents, principals, CFO/treasurers, guidance counselors, technology leaders, etc.
- Representation and coordination with community agencies and programs including Help Me Grow, Early Childhood Collaboratives, County Juvenile Courts, etc.
- Franklin B. Walter Scholarship recognition and celebration
- Ohio Migrant Education Center - fiscal agent and coordination of migrant services
- Surrogate parent recruitment and coordination
- Rollout of various ODE initiatives

2. Services offered for a fee include:

- Typically developing preschool students - cost determined per district program and grant funding
- Professional development for non-member districts - rate individually established based upon programs offered
- Professional development for member districts - Most at no fee but some are offered at a registration fee due to costs of programming
- Superintendent and treasurer searches for client districts - \$500 plus expenses
- On-line bloodborne pathogens training - \$50
- On-line child abuse and neglect identification training - \$50
- On-line communicable disease training - \$50
- On-line safety and violence prevention training - \$50
- On-line van driver pre-service training/recertification course - \$50
- On-line highly qualified teacher (HQT) in math, social studies, science, English language arts, pedagogy, and fine arts - \$100 member district employees and \$120 others
- Gifted test repository for whole grade testing materials - \$400 to enroll, and consumable testing materials based on costs - fees set annually
- Gifted test repository for individual use - cost based on materials requested (consumable and non-consumable)
- 21st Century Afterschool grant development, coordination, staffing and fiscal services - Fees dependent upon grant arrangements
- Resident Educator Services - Year 1=\$175, Year 2=\$150, Year 3=\$75, Year 4=\$50
- Fingerprinting - \$30 for BCII and \$35 for FBI
- Annual bus (4 hour) and van driver (2 hour) trainings for certification - cost determined by event expenses, currently \$12 per person
- Parapro testing - \$100
- Lincoln Interactive on-line courses - prices vary by course
- Facility rental - Contact superintendent to discuss needs and request pricing

Additional services offered on a cost reimbursement basis (Costs of mutually agreed upon services to the member districts are based on prorated, shared costs incurred by NwOESC but not limited to, any and all salary and fringe benefits such as retirement, medicare tax, insurance, workers compensation, severance pay, unemployment compensation, etc. for individuals employed by NwOESC to provide the services, professional development costs, travel costs, purchased services, supplies, equipment, an administrative support fee of 4.5% for member districts and 10% for non-member districts, and all other necessary expenses to operate each program and service). Those services offered to multiple districts are listed below:
