Apply now for our Voluntary Pre-K program!

Dickson County Schools is accepting applications for four-year-old children who meet the following requirements:

- 1) Four years old on or before August 15, 2019
- 2) Family resides in Dickson County (three proofs of residence required)
- 3) Family income must meet Federal Guidelines for income eligibility (proof of income such as 2018 tax form 1040 required or proof of program participation such as Food Stamps) (Refer to partial income chart below)
- 4) Out-of-zone family can transport to and from school daily.

HOW CAN YOU APPLY?

When: Weekdays from 9 am to 2 pm

Where: Elementary School Office

Procedure: Go to the front office of the Elementary School that provides the Voluntary Pre-K program and apply to your zoned school**.

Dickson County Schools provides the Voluntary Pre-K program at these schools: Dickson Elementary, Oakmont Elementary, Stuart-Burns Elementary, Vanleer Elementary, and White Bluff Elementary.

**Families zoned for Centennial Elementary, Charlotte

Elementary, Discovery School, or the new elementary school may apply to one school only and must be able to transport.

Q & A Ask math questions

Q: I've never felt comfortable with math. How should I talk to my children about what they're learning in math class?

A: Try to show enthusiasm for what your youngsters are doing in math. You might ask them each day at dinner or homework time what they studied in math that day. Let them explain the concepts they're working on, and follow up with questions. For instance, if they're learning about decimals, you could ask how decimal points are used in money (they separate the parts of a dollar from the whole dollar).

Then, when your children finish their homework, have them show you how they solved a few problems. As they explain their methods to you, they'll be reinforcing their own skills. And they'll be proud to be teaching you something! 📦



Bring these with you to apply:

- ✓ Child's proof of age, such as a birth certificate
- ✓ Current immunization and physical on state form from the pediatrician
- ✓ Three proofs of residence (driver's license, utility bill, rental agreement, etc.)
- ✓ Income verification for all adults in the household or program participation letter (such as Food Stamps)
