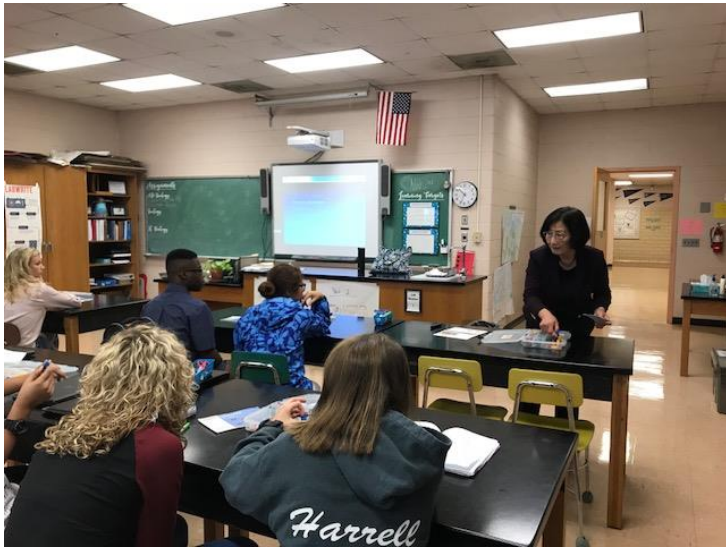


Student Wins Poetry Competition
