#### THIS THURSDAY - Flu Shot Clinic

It's never too early to get your flu shot! Asheboro City Schools will host a flu shot clinic on October 11 in the North Asheboro Middle School lobby of the auditorium and in the Central Office board room. Hours are 8 a.m. – 4 p.m. Appointments are not necessary. Please bring your BCBSNC member ID card and a photo ID.



### Open Enrollment - Now through Oct. 31

<u>State Health Plan Open Enrollment</u> – Click here to find comparison charts, rate sheets, and the 2019 Open Enrollment Video and Decision Guide. <u>The State Health Plan will conduct Open Enrollment September 30 - October 31. The choices you make during this period will be effective January 1 - December 31, 2019.</u>

If you do not complete the Open Enrollment, you will be enrolled in the 70/30 plan at the highest premium. If you want to pay the lowest premium, you <u>must</u> complete the tobacco attestation regardless of the plan you choose. If you are a new employee, you still <u>must</u> complete this enrollment to keep the lowest premium cost or choose the 80/20 plan. This enrollment is for health insurance only. Enrollment for dental, vision, etc. will be in the spring.

Important: During Open Enrollment, <u>all</u> active members and eligible dependents will automatically be enrolled into the traditional 70/30 plan. If you want to reduce your premium or enroll in the 80/20 plan, then you <u>must</u> take action during Open Enrollment. During Open Enrollment, members can: enroll in the state health plan; switch between plans; add or remove dependents without a qualifying life event (<u>please</u> remember when adding dependents to a benefit plan, you will be asked to provide documentation of dependent eligibility under the state health plan).

# Truliant Financial Education Grant Process Closes Friday

Truliant Federal Credit Union has opened its grant application period for the Financial Education Grants. The grant program, which will distribute a total of \$200,000 for financial literacy education through 2020, was launched in 2016. Annually, about \$40,000 is awarded to teachers through the Financial Education Grant program.

Teachers may apply individually or collaborate and apply as a department. A preliminary budget is required to demonstrate how the funds will be spent.
