Hours are 8 a.m. – 4 p.m. Appointments are not necessary. Please bring your BCBSNC member ID card and a photo ID.



Open Enrollment - Sept. 30 - Oct. 31

The State Health Plan will conduct Open Enrollment on September 30 - October 31. The choices you make during this period will be effective January 1 - December 31, 2019.

If you do not complete the Open Enrollment, you will be enrolled in the 70/30 plan at the highest premium. If you want to pay the lowest premium, you <u>must</u> complete the tobacco attestation regardless of the plan you choose. If you are a new employee, you still <u>must</u> complete this enrollment to keep the lowest premium cost or choose the 80/20 plan. This enrollment is for health insurance only. Enrollment for dental, vision, etc. will be in the spring.

Important: During Open Enrollment, <u>all</u> active members and eligible dependents will automatically be enrolled into the traditional 70/30 plan. If you want to reduce your premium or enroll in the 80/20 plan, then you <u>must</u> take action during Open Enrollment. During Open Enrollment, members can: enroll in the state health plan; switch between plans; add or remove dependents without a qualifying life event (<u>Please</u> remember when adding dependents to a benefit plan, you will be asked to provide documentation of dependent eligibility under the state health plan).

Truliant Financial Education Grant Process Now Open

Last Monday, Truliant Federal Credit Union opened its grant application period for the Financial Education Grants. The grant program, which will distribute a total of \$200,000 for financial literacy education through 2020, was launched in 2016. Annually, about \$40,000 is awarded to teachers through the Financial Education Grant program.

Teachers may apply individually or collaborate and apply as a department. A preliminary budget is required to demonstrate how the funds will be spent. Last week, sixth-grade students at North Asheboro Middle School participated in the annual Map Race activity!




Asheboro City Board of Education Earns Silver Award
