The following actions were taken by the Northwest Ohio Educational Service Center Governing Board at their regular meeting held May 28, 2019.

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by President Nona Rupp. All in attendance recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

REPORTS:

•OSBA LEGISLATIVE LIAISON: Brian Baker provided a legislative update. The Senate Finance Committee conducted several hearings on HB 166, which makes appropriations for the state operating budget for fiscal years 2020 and 2021, including the school-funding formula. The committee held an informal hearing on a graduation requirements proposal that may be included in the state budget bill. OSBA, BASA and the Ohio Association of Secondary School Administrators offered testimony on the proposal. The House Primary and Secondary Education Committee conducted a first hearing on HB 231. which requires the Department of Education to compile and publicize a list of entities that provide free epinephrine auto-injectors and to permit school districts to create training for staff and instruction for students on food allergies and allergic reaction treatment. The committee also conducted a third hearing on HB 123, which requires public schools implement certain programs regarding suicide awareness and prevention and violence prevention. The House Finance Committee conducted a first hearing on SB 4, which adds \$100 million to the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission budget for eight districts with shovel-ready projects. The committee also conducted a second hearing on HB 194, which legalizes and regulates sports gaming and earmarks a portion of the sports gaming profits for education. The House Economic and Workforce Development Committee conducted a first hearing on HB 4, which authorizes the Governor's Office of Workforce Transformation to develop an industry-recognized credential or a certificate program in response to a petition from an Ohio employer. The committee also conducted a second hearing on HB 2, which creates a regional workforce partnership grant program, under which school districts, career centers and others are eligible for grants to partner with employers and requires funds to be used for hiring coordinators, development of curricula or educational resources and marketing.

•OSBA STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT LIAISON: Sandy Friess reported on student achievement items of interest. Ms. Friess shared that by the time today's kindergarteners - the class of 2030 - enter the workforce things will look vastly different. Occupations will need expertise, creativity, grit and people who can learn and cultivate new skills. In a study and report by Microsoft, "Preparing the Class of 2030," it is suggested that our current system needs an overhaul and refreshed focus. Policymakers and educators are urged to ensure the nation is preparing the class of 2030 and each class after that for the future in a very different way: unprecedented opportunities for collaboration; the progressive automation of lower-skilled jobs; employers' demands for workers with more well-rounded skills; and students' desire and expectation to operate with autonomy and choice. In general, the study shows a need for a heightened focus on learners and more student-centric learning. Key educational changes advised in the study include more focus on helping students develop social-emotional skills, a shift to student-centered and personalized learning and the adoption of existing and emerging technologies.

•CFO/TREASURER: Homer Hendricks reviewed the OASBO Workshop and the spring OTESCA Conference where he attended sessions on eFinancePlus, crowdfunding, 457 and 403(b) plans, and federal procurement along with updates from ODE, the Auditor of State, and both organizations. He also participated in a legislative forum at Four County Career Center with four of the five area state representatives and senators answering questions from area administrators. Districts have all returned their service agreements for 2019-2020 and he has begun loading the district service agreements into ODE's online portal. Business office staff will be attending the statewide eFinance User Group meeting where users statewide share the knowledge they have gained about how to best use eFinancePlus. Final program costs for distribution to the districts on June 4 at the combined superintendent/treasurer meeting. Mr. Hendricks and Ms. Gearhart are working with several area districts on their superintendent and treasurer searches as well.

- •DIRECTOR OF SPECIAL EDUCATION: Jill Gilliland reported that preschool teachers recently completed the required spring round of ELA assessments for their students. There are 858 students currently enrolled in preschool for the 2018-19 school year. This number includes students with IEPs and typical peers. There are 352 total typical peer spots to fill for this coming year. Troy Slattman and Steve Hastings shared information at our May Superintendent meeting about CPI (Crisis Prevention Intervention) training. NwOESC CPI trainers include Jill Fouts, Kelly Groll, Troy Slattman, Beth Lewis, and Steve Hastings. Beth Lewis, Holly Wichman, and Laura Kamp attended a one-day train-the-trainer session called Understanding and Managing Trauma in the Classroom on May 16 in Pickerington, Ohio. Jessica Soltis and Beth Lewis represented the NWOESC at an Office of Exceptional Children stakeholder meeting on May 14 in Columbus. Feedback included recommending modifications and clarifications on the content and use of special education forms.
- •DIRECTOR OF CURRICULUM, INSTRUCTION, & PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT: Kris Dobbelaere, Director of Curriculum, Instruction and Professional Development, was absent but shared with the board in photos, recent events in the four county area. Kris was invited to judge Amazing Shake competitions at Swanton Middle School, Hicksville and Tinora as well as judging the Defiance County Amazing Shake finals held at Defiance College. She also shared recent four county principals' meetings where an update on the OTES revision was shared with principals. On May 13, the NwOESC and NWOCA hosted a STEAM showcase, which was attended by area schools, and businesses who shared STEAM initiatives and collaborative efforts. Attending this event were State Representative Jim Hoops, Ohio Representative Craig Riedel, and John Magill, Asst. Deputy Chancellor Department of Higher Education. On May 14, Josh Clark, NwOESC and Josh Biederstedt, Patrick Henry School shared their experiences with area administrators on the topic of When Tragedy Strikes. Planning for professional development is in process for the 2019-2020 school year.
- •DIRECTOR OF TECHNOLOGY: Mr. Chad Rex met with the communications team this month to present updates on the mobile app project, gather input and develop procedures for keeping the app updated for stakeholders. Mr. Rex stated that the last technology leader meeting of the year occurred this month. Mr. Rex shared that he and John Mansel-Pleydell, NWOCA's Instructional Services Supervisor, will be meeting with a leadership group in June to evaluate and collaboratively plan for the coming school year. Mr. Rex explained that the technology department's current focus is on hardware inventory and the reorganization of the main office's network rack.

•SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT: Kerri Gearhart reported that NwOESC has assisted in several Administrative Searches for area districts that are completed or in process: Northeastern Treasurer – completed with Sara Buchhop hired; Fayette Superintendent - completed with Angela Belcher hired; Bryan City CFO/Treasurer - in process; Wauseon Superintendent - in process; Holgate Treasurer/CFO - in process. NwOESC administrative staff and directors have been working to finish staff evaluations and get information input into the state data collection system for teacher evaluation – eTPES. Educators are rated Ineffective, Developing, Skilled, or Accomplished based on their performance as well as student growth. Sixty-three OTES evaluations were completed during the 2018-19 school year. This year NwOESC participated in the OTES prototype in partnership with Patrick Henry. For the coming year, NwOESC has applied to pilot the new OTES framework. Changes to OTES will come into effect statewide in the 2020-21 school year. The Four County Career Center Work Transition program recently held a luncheon to recognize student successes in the program and to honor area businesses who collaborate with students through work experiences. These businesses allow students to gain valuable on the job skills as they strive for independence. The businesses honored included: Archbold Supervalu, Care and Share, Sauder's (Manufacturing, Heritage Inn, The Barn, Village Grounds and Founders Hall), The Outback, The Loft, Three Cord, McDonalds, Northwest State CC, St. John's Christian Church, Zion Lutheran Church, Savvy Dog, and Northwest Ohio ESC. OMEC Recruiter, Betty Pacheco, was recently recognized at the National Migrant Education Conference held in New Orleans. Betty was nominated by OMEC Director, Jose Salinas, and was selected from all other nominees for national recognition due to her longstanding and excellent work. Her efforts in connecting Ohio migrant children to services is much appreciated! Congratulations to Betty on receiving this wonderful recognition! Over the next few months, a review of systems and processes will occur in preparation for the 2019-20 school year: Handbooks; Public School Works Training Plan; Employee Evaluation System; and Informational Updates (paper and website). Vehicle needs are being assessed for the coming year in regards to specialized programming.
