The following actions were taken by the Northwest Ohio Educational Service Center Governing Board at their regular meeting held June 25, 2019.

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by President Nona Rupp. All in attendance recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

REPORTS:

- •OSBA LEGISLATIVE LIAISON: Brian Baker provided a legislative update. The Senate passed HB 166 (Budget Bill) by a vote of 33-0. A conference committee will iron out the differences between the versions of the bill prior to its upcoming adoption. The House Primary and Secondary Education Committee amended and passed HB 123, which requires public schools to implement certain programs on suicide awareness and prevention and violence prevention. The amendment includes a provision to permit pre-existing clubs that have an adult adviser and are open to the student body to satisfy the bill's club requirement, provided that the pre-existing club implements suicide and violence prevention and social inclusion training and awareness. The committee also conducted a third hearing on HB 165, which requires the state to adopt health education standards, which may be utilized by public schools. The House Health Committee conducted a second hearing on HB 210 which would require Ohio Department of Education-licensed preschool programs and other entities to screen and test prospective employees for tuberculosis and annually test certain employees for a five-year period. The House Judiciary Committee conducted sponsor testimony on HB 208, which increases the penalty for assault if the victim is acting as a sports official or the assault is committed in retaliation for the victim's actions as a sports official.
- •CFO/TREASURER: Homer Hendricks reported the biennial budget process is being monitored as it winds down. The Senate has released their version of the bill and it will be heading to the conference committee to work out the differences between the House and Senate versions. The budget needs to be approved by the June 30 deadline to ensure there are minimal or no delays in funds coming from the state. Program cost invoices and other smaller invoices have been distributed to districts over the first few weeks of June to wrap up the fiscal year, with payments being received on several. As the fiscal year winds down, the business office is working on numerous year-end and new year processes. Several members of the business office staff attended the statewide eFinancePlus User Group meeting in Shelby on May 30. Actual eFinancePlus users organize and present at these meetings by sharing their processes on various modules within the system and facilitating discussion. NwOESC continues to work with the Williams County Board of Developmental Disabilities on their Summer Enrichment program. Dennis Meyers runs the program and coordinates with business office staff for staffing and purchasing.
- •DIRECTOR OF SPECIAL EDUCATION: Jill Gilliland provided a report that supervisors are doing a great job with staffing plans for the 2019-20 school year. Melissa Sears has done a fabulous job of tracking information on staff assignments, reassignments, newly hired staff, and new requests for staff from districts. Students will have the support and services they need to succeed thanks to this team effort. Each preschool student must be enrolled in PowerSchool before the start of the year. The Special Education Office Specialists and EMIS coordinator will be working on this project over the next month. Additionally the IEC will be utilizing PowerSchool next year to more efficiently manage attendance, course enrollment and to share this data with a student's home district.
- •DIRECTOR OF CURRICULUM, INSTRUCTION, & PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT: Kris Dobbelaere shared her report from the Curriculum and Professional Development Team. The 2019 Summer Honors Academy was held the week of June 10 with Defiance Elementary hosting. This year set a record attendance with 500 students attending. Kris thanked Katie Jimenez, coordinator of the event, Ashleigh Repp, who provided support in registrations making everything run smoothly as well as the Consultants who were there each day to assist. Professional Development plans were shared for the 2019-2020 school year with a theme of Creating Cultures of Excellence. The Educational Consultant Newsletter was shared with updates of their work as well as the Summer Honors Academy newsletter created by students who attended that week.

•DIRECTOR OF TECHNOLOGY: Chad Rex shared details about the summer projects that he and Corey Todd are working hard to complete before August. The annual inventory process is underway as well as the Active Directory and Google Admin Console synchronization process, redesigning and implementing a new server structure and completing a redesign and upgrade project in the ESC main office network closet. The conference room area that will enhanced through projection and presentation environment upgrades. There will be new HD projectors and mounted screens installed in the Defiance and Fulton Rooms. The Defiance Room will have a second projector and screen installed which will create a dual screen environment. The LPDC software will be moving to a new system with an implementation target of August. The special education office is nearing the completion of the PRESIS database project. The preschool phase is complete and the school age phase completion is set for September.
