

STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

Pennsylvania Shifts from the School Performance Profile to The Future Ready Index

Since 2013, each fall in Pennsylvania schools have been receiving a School Performance Profile score. Beginning in the fall of 2018, the Pennsylvania Department of Education will be shifting from the School Performance Profile to the Future Ready Index in order to meet the requirements of federal law as outlined in the Every Student Succeeds Act. The Future Ready Index will take a dashboard approach to providing the public with information regarding how schools are performing and making progress on multiple measures rather than providing the one summative school-level score previously provided by the School Performance Profile. Deeper Learning



Avonworth Middle School has committed to deeper learning experiences. The students also traveled to Washington DC to visit the National Museum of African-American History and Culture. Their work will continue in the 2018-2019 school year when they will produce a video to reflect their experiences together.

Cameron Galloway Received the Outstanding Student Award from the National Association of Home Builders



Avonworth Elementary School hosted Outdoor Adventures in its beautiful and resourceful outdoor learning space. Participants took part in hands-on activities that highlighted the ways our teachers are taking the classroom outside, as well as bringing the outdoors into the classroom. Avonworth Primary Center hosted a Pre-K Technology Night that allowed children to move through centers and explore the many different forms of technology that are integrated into learning.

JAM Enterprises is a group of 54 girls at Avonworth Primary Center who meet weekly to combine their creativity and compassion to help others. Their efforts in 2017-2018 led to the creation of the #bethekindkid campaign. Their message encourages kindness and has spread like wildfire not only



throughout our school community, but throughout the Pittsburgh area and beyond. JAM has now sold thousands of #bethek-indkid t-shirts. Profits from the shirts go to the American Cancer Association. During the 2017-2018 school year the girls of JAM Enterprises were able to donate approximately \$3,000 to local charities, as well as contribute to the Greater Pittsburgh Food Bank.

Avonworth student-athlete, Hunter Robinson, definitely left her mark not only at Avonworth but also at the WPIAL and State levels during her incredible high school track career. From 2016 to 2018 Hunter ran her way to a total of 2 team medals, 11 individual WPIAL medals, and 11 individual State medals. Hunter was also named to the All-State Team three years in a row, which is an accolade for being in the top 12 in the state of Pennsylvania. Hunter was also the anchor and leader of the 2017-2018 Girls Track Team that



brought the first-ever State Championship to the Avonworth School District. Hunter's efforts both in the classroom and on the track have earned her a full scholarship to Tulane University where she is continuing her track and academic career.

Historic Year for Avonworth Athletics

Avonworth Athletics experienced its most successful year ever in 2017-2018. Fifteen of our varsity teams reached the WPIAL playoffs. We added a WPIAL championship (Boys' Swimming) and a WPIAL runner-up trophy (Baseball), as well as two section championship plaques (Boys' Cross Country and Girls' Softball) to our ever-growing trophy collection. The following individuals also pushed beyond WPIAL competition to compete in PIAA tournaments: Girls' Cross Country runner Anna Igims; Swimmers Karen Siddoway, Aidan Sommers, Nick Madey, Cooper Groll, Luke Wagner, and Luke Tomzcak; and Track athletes Hunter Robinson, Hayden Robinson, Harris Robinson, Catherine Penrod, and Lauren Pflueger. In addition to our individual students competing at the state level, our Girls' Volleyball, Boys' Baseball, and Girls' Softball teams also made it to PIAA Playoff Tournaments.

The biggest story to come out of athletics in 2017-2018 was provided by our Girls' Track Team, who brought the first-ever State Championship to Avonworth. Our Avonworth girls compete as part of a cooperative agreement with Northgate. Our combined team of Avonworth and Northgate puts us in the largest school division. Yet, we are the smallest AAA school in the WPIAL and the 4th smallest school in the PIAA competing in track. Competing against much larger schools, our girls came away with two gold medals and a silver medal for individual performances, a bronze medal and 5th place finish in two relay events, as well as the 1st place trophy for the first-ever Team State Championship in school history.



Unified Sports Program

Sportsmanship, friendly competition, and school spirit are the foundations of the Avonworth High School Unified Sports Bocce Team. The team, founded in the 2016-2017 school year, is affiliated with Special Olympics and embraces a message of inclusiveness. The team competes against other western Pennsylvania teams throughout the region.





School Safety Update

The Avonworth School District has a positive and collaborative relationship with the Ohio Township Police Department (OTPD) and the Ohio Township Fire Department (OTFD), well as other local municipality support. The District has a Memorandum of Understanding with the Ohio Township Police Department that formalized this support relationship. Included in the support from the OTPD is a School Resource Officer (SRO). Corporal



Chris Simcoviak has served as the SRO for Avonworth for twenty years. He serves on the High School Student Assistance Team and the District's Safety/Security Committee, facilitates the Elementary School DARE program, and provides safety support district-wide.

In the 2018-2019 school budget, the Avonworth Board of Directors set aside additional funds to increase safety measures. These funds will be utilized to increase the School Resource Officer position to full time. The District will also be hiring additional school security and making additional security improvements. One of these improvements that was in place for the start of the 2018-2019 school year was the installation of security gates on both the elementary and primary campuses. These gates will provide additional safety for our younger students when they are utilizing our outdoor play areas.


The Avonworth School District also continues to ensure measures are in place to meet the mental health needs of our students. Each school building has a full-time, highly qualified school counselor on site. Our school counselors provide numerous supports to our students including classroom lessons, individual consultation, and group support. Our counselors are also critical components of each building's Student Assistance Program teams, which seek to connect students and families with additional supports.

Additionally, Avonworth School District staff have participated in a variety of safety-related trainings. Listed below are some of the trainings staff members have received to prepare them to provide a safe environment and respond in case of emergencies:
