Restorative Practice Corner.

Many sources of information exist and are available in regards to restorative practices and how they are used within schools. These sources include books, websites, articles, and videos. The information provided within them are important for all stakeholders (educators, parents, students, and the larger community) to be aware of in order to assist a school in truly developing a restorative culture. One source in particular is the toolkit entitled

"Restorative Practices: Fostering Healthy Relationships & promoting Positive Discipline in Schools." Although this toolkit is promoted as a guide specifically for educators, the material within it is significant and succinct enough to help anyone gain a better understanding of restorative practices.

At only 13 pages long, this quick read highlights what restorative practices are, different types of restorative practices, why restorative practices are needed, the difference between zero-tolerance policies and restorative practices, what to think about when trying to implement restorative practices, and examples of districts that use restorative practices extensively. Please take the time to view this toolkit, and hopefully you'll share the perspective and ideas it may inspire within you with us. By doing so, we can really collaborate as a community to help form the way restorative practices are implemented at WBV in the future.
