This year has seen some significant changes for Northview Research. The College Board accepted Sylvania Schools into the AP Capstone Program (one of only three schools in NW Ohio and 1,100 worldwide). Honors STEM Research transitioned to AP Capstone, a two-year program consisting of AP Seminar and AP Research. Seminar students focused on researching many diverse topics of interest, including artificial intelligence's role in society and economics, conflict in Uganda, the ethics of stem cell research, the debate over kneeling at the National Anthem, issues with capital punishment, gun issues in the US, biotechnology's affect on abortion debate, the ethics and economics of assisted suicide, legalization of medical marijuana, and how perception affects our reality.

One of our students continued her research under Honors STEM. Nora Kaushy Gera developed her research plan in late spring 2017 and worked with Dr. Ajith Karunarathne at University of Toledo over the summer in his lab. Kaushy developed an algorithm to track and quantify the movement of cells with light-sensitive GPCRs that migrate as they are attracted to attracted to blue light (445 nm). The computer code both recognizes the PIP3 accumulation on the leading edge by comparing fluorescence intensity at an infinitesimally small pixel-level to other pixels surrounding it, and it also tracks movement of the PIP3 fluorescence over time. With the use of this computer code, tracking accretions formed on the leading edge as well as the retraction of the back edge of the cell can be simultaneously recorded. Her work significantly reduced the analysis time and was comparable to the analysis performed by much more expensive equipment, saving an estimated \$55,000. Kaushy presented her work at Ohio Academy of Science (OAS) Northwest District Science Day and Ohio Junior Science and Humanities Symposium (OJSHS). Kaushy won top honors at OAS and will progress to OAS State Science Day and Buckeye Science and Engineering Fair (BSEF). Kaushy placed third at OJSHS and will represent Ohio at the National JSHS. Kaushy has just found out that she has been accepted to Cornell University and is waiting to hear from MIT. She will be continuing her research at an lvy League level this fall. Congratulations Kaushy!

AP Seminar students attended OJSHS, which inspired them through all the incredible research presented there. We are looking forward to many more exciting projects next year in AP Research next year. We are very proud of all of our Wildcats!












procedures are in compliance with the Ohio Revised Code. Also, review this section in the student handbook, which explains in detail what will be considered an **excused** absence.

Attendance Procedures:

- · Please call the attendance office at 824-8710 to report an absence. We have voicemail so a call can be made to the office 24 hours a day.

We are excited about the upcoming school year! We continue to offer food options that are not only healthy, but kid's favorites.

<u>MySchoolBucks</u> - We strongly encourage all parents and guardians to discuss meal options and responsible purchases with their children. Also, please consider using <u>myschoolbucks.com</u> as a tool for you, the parent/guardian, to review your child's purchases and manage their lunch account balance. There is no charge to set up an account and monitor your child's cafeteria purchases.

<u>Breakfast</u> - During the 2017-2018 school year, we will have several options available every day for breakfast. Let us provide your kiddos with a healthy breakfast daily! As a bonus, you get more time in the morning! Breakfast is offered at 9 of our 12 schools: Hillview, Maplewood, Stranahan, Sylvan, Whiteford, Arbor Hills, McCord, Northview and Southview.

<u>Menus</u> - The 2017-2018 menus will be available at <u>www.sylvaniaschools.org</u> after July 30, 2017. Our menu will be updated again after winter break.

No kid goes hungry - We will never take food from a child in the lunch line. However, lunch and breakfast charges will be the responsibility of the student's parent or guardian and will be collected like other student fees.

<u>Meal account balances</u> - Letters are sent home once a month if a student's lunch account balance is over \$20.00 in arrears. If the account is not brought current, the charges will then be applied to the student's Power School account and must be paid at the Treasurer's Office. In this instance, a letter is also mailed to the home address on record.

<u>Meal accounts</u> - In an attempt to make certain no student goes without breakfast or lunch, our system has been configured to allow students to charge full meals (**not** a la carte items) when they do not have food with them or money on their lunch account.

<u>Charging is for emergencies</u> - Our new charge system is required by the state of Ohio. It is intended to be used for the occasional time when a child does not have funds in their lunch account or does not have lunch money with them. The intention of this system is **not** to create a revolving charge account.

<u>Set limitations</u> -The student's meal account can have specific limitations set to accommodate the parent request(s) regarding food purchases and/or monetary limits. The food service staff is available to discuss these options at (419) 824-8655 or (419) 824-8511.

<u>Need assistance?</u> The application for free and reduced meals for the 2017-2018 school year should be available at: <u>sylvaniaschools.org/our-school-district/administration/food-service</u> <u>after July 15, 2017.</u> Paper applications will be available at school offices <u>after July 30, 2016.</u>

NOTE: Re-application is required each school year for all students.
