Professional Learning Experience for ACS Employees

The AIG department is sponsoring a hybrid professional learning experience for ACS employees. It is comprised of two face-to-face sessions and an eight module Canvas course. The first face-to-face session will be held on Tuesday, June 12 from 8:30-11:30 a.m. in room 111 at SAMS. The second session will be held in early fall 2018 at the completion of the Canvas course. The Canvas course will be open during the summer for participants to complete at home. Participants will be expected to attend both face-to-face sessions, complete all module posts, and submit a lesson using a differentiation strategy covered in the Canvas course for successful completion of the course requirements. Objectives for participants include:

- 1. Increased awareness of traditional and nontraditional gifted characteristics; underrepresented populations, and social/emotional needs of gifted learners;
- 2. Implementation of research-based, effective differentiation strategies in the gifted cluster classroom;
- 3. Development and implementation of a lesson that incorporates a method, module, or differentiation strategy for gifted learners.
