

Featuring a 1:1 student-to-technology ratio and an array of hands-on learning opportunities, our students grow to become problem-solvers, critical thinkers, and innovators by the time they graduate. From coding and robotics to graphic design, photography, and more, developing 21st century learners is an intentional effort at the very core of our district, academic philosophy.



OhioHealth BERGER CARE CLINIC

What sets us apart from many schools in 2019 is our commitment to staff and student health and wellness. The OhioHealth Berger Tiger Care Clinic operates Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8 a.m. – 11 a.m. The clinic offers students an opportunity to be seen by a certified nurse practitioner or physician. In keeping up with family and work schedules in 2019, we understand that sometimes there are logistical barriers to getting students seen by a licensed physician in a timely fashion. We are proud to work alongside OhioHealth Berger to keep our students healthy and in school.

On-site Mental Health Services



Let's talk about it. When it comes to mental health, we believe there should be no stigma associated with providing access and supports to students needing someone to talk to. Growing up can be challenging and thanks to a partnership with The Counseling Source, LLC of Greater Cincinnati, we offer six licensed mental health clinicians throughout our three buildings to work with students and families on identifying a path to a healthier you. The organization provides accredited and certified practitioners, under the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services, who implement an array of services including mental health assessments, screenings, group and individual counseling, 24-hour on-call-support, and so much more.



OHIO DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION RECOGNIZED MILITARY FRIENDLY SCHOOLS

The Purple Star designation is placed on schools that are military friendly, host an annual military themed event, and designate a liaison to assist active duty families with streamlining supports for their child's education. Over 10% of all CCS students have direct ties to the Armed Forces. As a district, we are committed to reducing educational barriers, preparing students for a potential military career, honoring our servicemen and service women, and working with all of our military families to provide support for their children along their academic journey.



Title I funding at CCS is a federally funded education program that works to give all children a chance to learn at a higher academic standard. The purpose is to prevent failure by ensuring that more children experience success in school. Sometimes children need assistance to meet the standards Ohio has set for all children including children who:

- Have trouble reading
- Read below their grade level
- Have trouble understanding what they read
- Have difficulty with math



The grant builds on Ohio's commitment to ensuring all students have the reading skills needed to succeed in their education and life.




A CULTURE OF SUCCESS


