GOAL 1: Students participating in state assessments will demonstrate an increase in **MATH** performance as evidenced by an increase in the Performance Index (PI) from 79.7 (77.56 in 2016) to 108 by 2018.

GUAL 2: Students participating in state assessments will demonstrate an increase in **READING** performance as evidenced by an increase in the Performance Index (PI) from 80.5 (72.3 in 2016) to 108 by 2018.

<u>GOAL 3</u>: <u>Attendance Rate</u> will increase from 93.7% (93.8% in 2016) (by 1% or more each year) to 96% by 2018 by implementing evidence-based school climate strategies.
