Dear Bath Community,

Welcome to the 2019-20 school year! Thank you to all of the parents, grandparents and our school staff for your efforts and patience transitioning into our OneView portal. We believe this will improve upon our communication, enrollment processes and provide an easier transition for parents each year when it comes to our required forms.

We are excited to roll out our Naviance program to students in grades 6 through 12. All of these students and parents have been given access to this career and college readiness tool. We encourage all parents to log in and engage their son/daughter with this platform as soon as possible. The more interactions, conversations and experiences we can provide our students, the more likely they will familiarize themselves with the website and better utilize the success tools within it.

Recently, the Ohio Department of Education released our Local Report Card. Unfortunately, we did drop in our overall grade from a B to a C missing a B by .087 points. Over the summer we made some major improvements to our facilities. Our track was re-surfaced and our middle school and high school gyms were re-finished. They all look amazing! (See photos below)

We believe all employees and students at Bath reflect the values and characteristics represented in this seal. We have multiple signs in each building that display the Wildcat Way. Finally, this December we will be honoring six people and inducting them into our Bath Hall of Fame. This will be our first year for this event and we couldn't be more excited! It's a chance for us as a district to formally recognize those individuals who have graduated from Bath High School or have been contributing members to our Bath community, that have excelled in the fields of athletics, community service or their professional careers. The six inductees are Paulett Eberhart ('71), Robert Hempker ('66), Joe Kitchen ('88), Vicki Mauk ('76), Gretchen Prichard (teacher, coach 1958-1997), and Jerry Ward ('60). We plan on having a Hall of Fame weekend December 13th and 14th whereby these people will be recognized at a boys' basketball game on Friday December 13th against Kenton, followed by a dinner ceremony on Saturday night in our high school cafeteria at 6:00pm. The dinner is open to the public and will be catered by Lock Sixteen. Tickets for the event may be purchased until November 30th and are \$20 each. TITLE I PROGRAM AT BATH ELEMENTARY CONTINUES TO SERVE BATH READERS

Title One continues to be a support program to supplement learning in the regular classroom. Bath Elementary is a Title One school, which means any elementary student can benefit from Title One services. The purpose of the Title One program is to aid in the development of a school/parent partnership which will help all children achieve the high standards required by the state. The reading lab will teach onset-rimes, phoneme awareness, sight words, phonics, fluency, vocabulary development, and text comprehension to help prepare students for the rigorous state assessments. The teachers and parents share the responsibility for improved student achievement.

This year we have four Title One teachers. Kristin Lenhart has worked with Title I students the past three years. Previously, Mrs. Lenhart was a second and a third grade teacher. This is her 12th year at Bath Elementary. She has two children: Ryan, who is 5, and Madison, who is 3. Kelley Counts comes to us this year from Findlay City Schools. She has been teaching reading intervention for the past 10 years. Mrs. Counts and her husband, Casey, have two boys: Caden, who is 6, and Cooper, who is 2. Tara Herr and Jacob Brunk are certified elementary teachers who have worked as part-time tutors. Tara Herr worked as a middle school math tutor last year. She is a familiar face to many with her involvement in coaching Junior Varsity Girls Soccer and assistant coach to the Varsity Girls Basketball team. Mr. Brunk has been with the Title I program for three years and is a Lima native. He is a recent graduate from Mt. Vernon Nazarene University. He and his wife, Tova, reside in Lima. All Title One salaries are paid through Title One funding.

After September DIBELS testing of all Bath students, the intensive reading students will receive 30 minute, small group, interventions with Title One teachers in addition to their classroom instruction. Title One students do not come to the reading lab during classroom instructional time. To build the school/parent relationship it is critical that parents assist students at home with any of the following:

- Review the Saxon word lists and other sight words
- Practice weekly spelling words and reading vocabulary words nightly
- Read to your child and with your child each night
- Discuss what happens in the stories you read...ask about characters, setting, plot, and solutions
- Ask your child often if there are things they do not understand about reading
- Contact us if there are questions or concerns regarding your child’s reading

All Bath parents were encouraged to attend a parent orientation and informational meeting on October 2 from 6:00-6:30 p.m. where parents were updated and provided opportunities to ask questions they may have had regarding the Title One program. Students attending extra intervention with the Title One teachers received parent invitations for this meeting. Together, we hope to make this a positive learning experience with significant academic growth in reading for all our students. Please feel free to contact any of the Title One teachers with questions or concerns regarding your child’s reading.

OFF TO A GOOD START

The 2019-2020 school year is off to a successful start. Students were anxious to return, and our staff were well prepared. The amazing turnout to our Open House on August 22nd also contributed to the successful start. We had 92% of our students/families attend our Open House.

Our kindergarteners did not attend school until the third day so kindergarten teachers could administer the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment (KRA) to them. This helped each kindergarten student transition into the school year as well, allowing each teacher the opportunity to spend one-on-one time with each student. Our all-day, every day kindergarten seems to be off to a good start. Students are getting into the routine of the schedule. There are many signs early in the year that this is going to be a great year!

THIRD GRADE READING ACHIEVEMENT TEST

This year's third graders will take the first round of the reading achievement test on October 22 and 23.

According to the Third Grade Reading Guarantee, all students must obtain a minimum score on either the fall or spring reading assessment in order to move into the fourth grade. Any third grader who does not score the minimum score on the fall or spring test will be required to come to summer school and take the summer reading assessment.

Ohio's Third Grade Reading Guarantee directs schools to identify which students in kindergarten through grade three are having trouble reading and provide extra support immediately. The goal is to get these students caught up in reading as soon as possible. Studies show that children who are behind in reading at the end of grade three will have a hard time in all subjects in the fourth grade and beyond. After that, it can be hard for a child to catch up in school.

Under the Third Grade Reading Guarantee, Bath Elementary School will determine at the start of each year how well each child in kindergarten through grade three is reading. We will then create a special reading plan for each child who is behind. Teachers who are experienced in teaching reading will work with these students. If you have a son or daughter who still struggles with reading at the end of grade three, we will talk with you about keeping your child in third grade until he or she catches up. This may be all or only part of the school year. Even then, though, your child may do fourth-grade work in other subjects if he or she is ready.

There are special rules about the guarantee that can help children who are still learning English and children who have disabilities. Read more about the Third Grade Reading Guarantee at education.ohio.gov, or talk with your child's teacher for more details.



Elementary Safety Patrol

Bath Elementary inducted its most recent safety patrol members on Friday, September 13 in front of the fourth and fifth grade student body. Students interested in being a safety patrol member had to apply for patrol positions. Teacher recommendations were also considered when selecting the patrol members. The purpose of the safety patrol is to help teachers and administrators monitor the student body while entering and exiting the building. The patrol members encourage the student body to make healthy and safe choices. The younger students often slow down as they see a patrol member so that they may receive a high five from an upperclassman. Patrol members also maintain the lost and found area. Throughout the past several years, feedback has been received as the program has developed. A big thank you goes out to the leadership of the safety patrol members and their willingness to accept extra responsibilities for the betterment of our student body. Go Wildcats! #Wildcatway

CAREER EDUCATION AT BMS

Bath Middle School will once again place an increased emphasis on career education. An exciting change to our career education plan will be the addition of Naviance, a college and career readiness software program created to partner with K-12 schools. Naviance provides students with college planning and career assessment tools. All middle school students will be involved in this program this school year.

In addition to the Naviance program, the middle school will be expanding our career education plan that was initiated last year. The sixth grade students will be exposed to numerous career fields via guest speakers. Sixth grade students will also receive career based information during their keyboarding/technology class.

The Ohio Department of Education has developed 16 various clusters for students. Bath Middle School staff members are certified to provide information to our students in each of these 16 clusters. This year, students in grades 7 and 8 will receive information in the career clusters listed below.

The career education instruction takes place within the regular school day schedule. Students move from one career cluster to another on a scheduled rotation. It is our goal that after completing 8th grade, students will have received valuable career information in 15 different career fields. While we do not expect students in the middle school to make career decisions, we hope to provide them with information that may provoke thoughts about possible careers in the future.


