What is College Credit Plus?



College Credit Plus

- CC+ was designed to increase dual enrollment opportunities for students to earn college and high school credits at the same time.
- The purpose of this program is to promote rigorous academic pursuits and to provide a wide variety of options for Bellbrook students.
- As required by law, Bellbrook Sugarcreek Schools will bear all tuition costs for classes taken through public universities. Students choosing to enroll in a participating private college or university may incur limited costs.

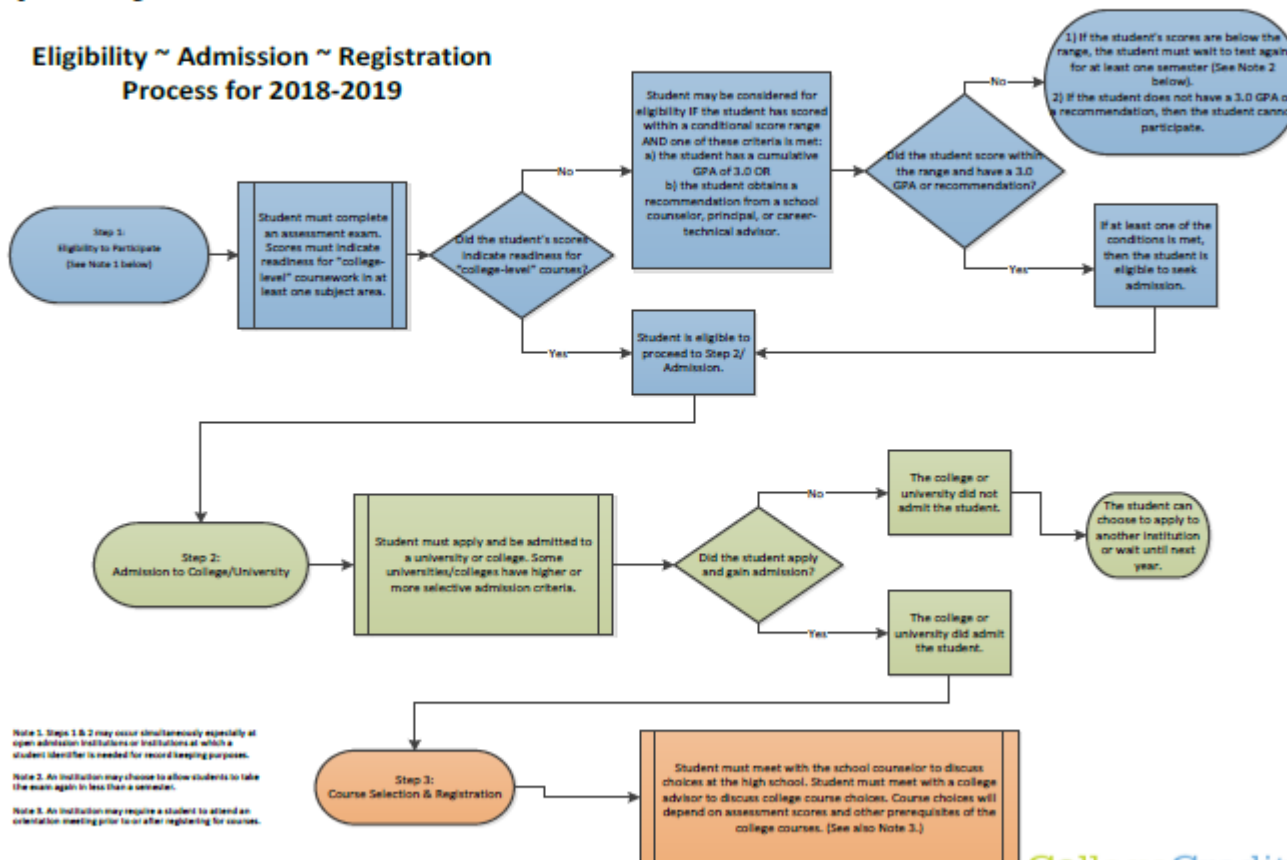

College Credit Plus

College Credit Plus: Student Eligibility Process

Effective Academic Year 2018-2019, a student interested in College Credit Plus must complete the steps in the chart below to determine eligibility, admission, and course placement/registration.



Note 1. Steps 1 & 2 may occur simultaneously especially at open admission institutions or institutions at which a student identifier is needed for record keeping purposes.

Note 2. An institution may choose to allow students to take the exam again in less than a semester.

Note 3. An institution may require a student to attend an orientation meeting prior to or after registering for courses.

Who is Eligible?

“College-ready” students who qualify for college admission.

Consider social/emotional readiness, organization and time management skills

Students must meet admission requirements and deadlines.

This includes a qualifying ACT/SAT exam score or a placement test.



Scheduling



Must be a full-time student
(min. 6 credits per sem.)

Can earn up to 30 college
credit hours per academic
year.

No more than 120 college
credit hours while in the
program.

May take classes during the
summer, fall and spring
semesters

Scheduling

- $30 - (\text{high school only credits} \times 3) = \text{Maximum number of College Credit Plus credit hours}$

High School Courses:

English 12 = $1 \times 3 = 3$

Govt = $1 \times 3 = 3$

Art 1 = $.5 \times 3 = 1.5$

Per Fin = $.5 \times 3 = 1.5$

Fall CCP Courses:

Psych = 3 sem hrs

Calculus = 5 sem hrs

Chemistry = 4 sem hrs

Spring CCP Courses:

Sociology = 3 sem hrs

Biology = 4 sem hrs

Total Hours:

HS = 9

+CCP = 19

- If student takes more than 30 credit hours, student has option to drop or pay for class at the standard college rate plus cost of books for the additional credit hours.

Scheduling cont.

- Must work with High School Counselor and College Academic Advisor to complete CCP & H.S. schedule.
 - Allowable vs. Non-Allowable courses
 - Student will be held financially responsible if signed up for a non-allowable course
 - Example: Sinclair Community College
- College Advisors will help students know which courses they can take based on:
 - Assessment scores
 - Course prerequisites
 - Level I (first 15 hours) or Level II
- Must complete all high school graduation required courses.
 - Courses must satisfy high school graduation requirements
 - Course Substitution Crosswalk

Failure or Withdrawal from a CCP Course

- No credit is awarded for a failed course
- If the failed course is a requirement for high school graduation, it must be retaken and completed before graduation
- **Financial responsibility belongs to the student and his/her parents in the case of failure or withdrawal**
- Underperforming Students – student is placed on CCP probation when they earn lower than a 2.0 cumulative GPA in college courses or withdraw from 2 or more courses in same term
 - Probation & Dismissal

Grades

- All advanced standing programs will be weighted the same within subject area.
Example: no weight for Art CCP courses
- BHS transcripts show both a weighted and non weighted GPA. The 4.0 scale is used for honor roll and NHS eligibility
- In order to determine valedictorian, students will receive quality points of .05 for every AP and/or College Credit Plus class



EOC

- Students must complete End of Course exams for English, Math and Science
- CCP courses in History will satisfy the EOC requirement if the student takes either Government or US History
 - Example: PLS 1120 at WSU, student gets a B, equals a 5 for the Government exam

Academic Credit: CCP to BHS

Convert college credit as follows:

3 or more semester hour college course = 1 credit at BHS

2 semester hour college course = 0.66 credits at BHS

1 semester hour college course = 0.33 credits at BHS

Academic Credit: Colleges

- If a student attends the same college after high school graduation, full credit is transferred.
- Students should check transfer policies of the college(s) of interest.

- Credit is not guaranteed at out of state public colleges and private universities.
 - Some colleges do not accept CCP credits taught by BHS instructors.
- **YOU** must request your college transcripts

Extracurricular & Athletic Eligibility

- CCP students are allowed to participate in all Bellbrook High School activities.
- Ohio High School Athletic Association and NCAA rules govern eligibility. Students must meet athletic eligibility requirements to participate.

How to Apply for CCP courses offered at BHS



1. Student completes online application
 - Sinclair only: Student turns in Authorization form to Mrs. Scohy
2. Student takes placement test, if needed
 - Placement testing will only be offered at BHS on **May 21 and May 22 at 1 pm** during the make-up exams time
3. Student receives acceptance letter in mail
4. Mrs. Scohy registers students for course and verifies roster

Benefits vs. Risks of CCP

Benefits

- Extends the HS curriculum
- Earn both high school and college credit
- Financial benefit
- Savings in cost and time by taking Basic Education Requirements before entering College
- Experience College early to understand the expectations of college life

Benefits vs. Risks of CCP

Risks

- Increased STUDENT responsibility
- Scheduling conflicts (athletics, field trips, spring break, and other school functions);
- Athletic/Extra-curricular eligibility
- Affects GPA “College Transcript Lives Forever”
- Could affect Financial Aid
- Risk of credits not transferring
- Cost of transportation
- Weather - Scheduling conflict with 2hr delays
- Could incur financial obligation if course is dropped or failed (add-drop dates)
- No parent access to student progress until final grade (FERPA)

Summary of Steps

- Sign & return INTENT TO PARTICIPATE (**by April 1st**)

Option 1: Off Campus

- Go online and complete application
- Return any required documents for application to Mrs. Scohy
- Schedule placement testing if needed
- Once you are accepted it is your responsibility to verify individual college procedures, requirements and deadlines (ex. attend orientation, schedule classes)
- Schedule your college classes and update your schedule at BHS

Option 2: At BHS

- Complete online application
- Return any required documents for application to Mrs. Scohy
- Complete placement testing if you do not have a qualifying ACT/SAT score
