SUBJECT:	COVID-19 Guidance

This memo provides revised guidelines for NYSED State and Federally administered adult education programs to provide the maximum allowable flexibility in providing continuity of learning and student engagement for adult education programs. The major priority is to provide flexibility for and support for online learning now that face-to-face classes have become unavailable across the State. We will provide additional webinars for Employment Preparation Education (EPE) training and Adult Literacy Education (ALE) and Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) specific policies and steps in the coming weeks.

WIOA and ALE funded programs:

Consistent with WIOA, Title II, Subtitle C, Section 231(e)(7), (9) & (11), NYSED is allowing and encouraging these programs to continue instruction with students via distance learning, including online tools:

- Reminder: The guidance provided here is dependent upon events considered temporary in nature. Existing guidelines and requirements remain in effect and are only waived temporarily and to the extent set forth herein. The guidance provided here shall apply until revoked upon face-to-face classes becoming more readily available across the State;
- NYSED has created a spreadsheet (NYSED WIOA and ALE Adult Literacy Coronavirus Online Learning Planning Tool) where programs will be asked to identify the plan for delivering these services;
- The initial deadline for submitting the plan, the NYSED WIOA and ALE Adult Literacy Coronavirus Online Learning Planning Tool, is March 27th. Plans must be submitted to their respective funding program's mailbox (<u>WIOA@NYSED.gov</u> or <u>ALE@NYSED.gov</u>). Subsequently, programs may submit new or amended plans as needed to reflect changes in programming;
- The Online Learning Planning Tool can include both Synchronous and Asynchronous learning options for students;

COVID-19 Guidance Memo Released March 20, 2020

From our NYSED fiscal representatives:

There has not yet been an announcement from the New York State Division of Budget (DOB) regarding possible FY21 reductions. Budget Bulletin B-1223 directs agencies to hold all discretionary local aid grants and awards until further notice and to submit essential and statutory payments to DOB for their approval. Payments are being made as they receive approval from DOB. For some Statefunded programs, payments have been made at 80% of the original amount, with the remaining 20% on hold at this time.

Individual Student Record Form In FY2020/2021, programs must have an electronic or paper copy of the ISRF for all students, dated on or after July 1, 2020 with student signature

- Electronic
- Paper

Data in ASISTS

Recorded in ASISTS regardless if remote or in person

- Student demographic data
- Student contact information
- Assessments given in person only

Attendance

Instructional classes in ASISTS: TWO OPTIONS

- Carry over existing classes from FY2019/2020
- Create new classes that will represent face to face attendance

As programs gradually move from remote to face to face:

- Remote contact hours are uploaded to the Accountability site
- In person contact hours are recorded in ASISTS

Assessments

- Existing Pre-tests that were given in FY2019/2020 between January 1, 2020 and March 20, 2020 will continue to be honored
- Existing Post tests between January 1, 2020 and March 20, 2020 will be brought into FY2020/2021 and used as new pre-tests
 - This will happen AFTER August 15th (the data deadline for FY2019/2020 data)

Reopening

- Gradual and well planned
- Safety first
- NYSED Distance Learning Planning Tool
 - Must be updated when there are major changes
 - Must be approved by the AEPP Regional staff
 - Email any updates to: <u>ALE@nysed.gov</u> <u>WIOA@nysed.gov</u>

Reopening There is not one reopening plan

- Each program is funded differently
- Each program may reopen differently
- Planning and coordination are key elements
- Follow safety rules imposed by your hosting agencies/school districts/BOCES
- Community Based Organizations or off-campus locations may need to be added/altered

Reopening

When in-person programming begins

- Priority:
 - Assessments must be face to face
 - Lower level learners
 - Learners who have little or no access to technology

<u>Reminder:</u>

- If students are able to come back for even a portion of the time
 - Time spent in person is recorded in ASISTS
 - Time spent remotely is recorded on the Accountability site

Pilot Distance Learning Options

An application process will be available in **November** Application to include:

- Curricula
- Staffing and Staff expectations
- Modality
- Calculation of proxy contact hours
- Documentation of student work
- Data collected in ASISTS
- # of students participating in the pilot
- Expected outcomes
- Technology requirements (students/program)

- EPE program delivers through ESL Home Study and remote or in-person for 3 hour tutoring sessions
- Meetings with NYSED will be scheduled in September
