The District and the Community

The Trimble Local School District encompasses approximately 36 square miles in the northern part of Athens County in southeastern Ohio. The district includes the Villages of Jacksonville, Glouster, and Trimble. With an approximate enrollment of 830 students and 70 teachers, the district houses one elementary school, a middle school, and a high school.

Just over an hour from Columbus, three from Cincinnati, and three from Pittsburgh, Athens County is a popular destination spot for outdoor enthusiasts, art lovers, history buffs and anyone who wants to escape the fast pace of the city. Burr Oak State Park, located just north of Glouster, offers a wide array of overnight accommodations with its lodge, cottages and campground as well as opportunities for boating, swimming, and fishing. Athens County, is also home to Ohio University and Hocking College offering unique restaurants, shops, community and cultural activities.

TECHNOLOGY

Trimble Local is a 1 to 1 district with all students in K-12 having access to a personal Chromebook. All teaching staff also have a Chromebook to integrate technology into lessons and use Google Classroom. All rooms are equipped with Promethean interactive boards and we also have several 3-D printers.



RETIREMENT

The Trimble Local School District participates in the Ohio State Teachers Retirement System (STRS). By statute, the district must withhold 14% of contributable earnings from each pay in conjunction with an employer contribution of 14% of contributable earnings for each teaching employee. The conference is divided into two divisions; the Ohio Division and the Hocking Division.
