

Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES)
Madison Adult Career Center
Quarter ending 12/31/2021

Madison Adult Career Center (MACC) has signed and returned the Certification and Agreement to the Department of Education to provide emergency financial aid grants to students for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to the coronavirus pandemic.

MACC received an initial student HEERF allocation of \$55,051, followed by \$55,051 (HEERF II), and finally \$185,229 (HEERF III), for a total student allocation of \$295,331. As of 12/31/21 \$149,296 has been distributed to students.

As of 12/31/21, MACC has distributed \$149,296 in HEERF student allocations to students enrolled in Career Development programs as follows:

- 2019-20 School year (students enrolled spring or summer of 2020) \$55,051 distributed to 75 students.
- 2020-21 school year \$55,051 distributed to 96 students.
- 2021-22 school year \$39,194 distributed to 37 students. MACC Estimates that 87 students could be eligible in the 2021-22 school year. Our programs start at various times throughout the school year and will continue to identify eligible students on a rolling basis, until funds are expended.

MACC determined amounts per student based on enrollment, program hours, and student need. MACC also maintains an application for emergency funding which was, and continues to be, made available to all enrolled students. Students can complete an application and demonstrate additional need for Emergency Financial Aid Grants for expenses incurred related to the disruption of campus operation due to the coronavirus pandemic. Expenses can include food, housing, course materials, technology, health care and child care.
