Set realistic goals. Encourage your child to pick one or two areas to work on. Make sure they know exactly what they want to accomplish. Example – read a new book each month.

Measurable - How will they know when they reached their goal?

Achievable - Make sure their goal is not too far to reach, but make it challenging.

Relevant - Link the goal to something important.

Timely - Have an idea of when you want to reach your goal. If it is longer term, have mini-goals along the way.



The Restorative Paradigm Shift.



Traditional Approach	Restorative Approach
School and rules violated	People and relationships violated
Justice focuses on establishing guilt	Justice identifies needs and obligations
Accountability = punish- ment	Accountability = under- standing impact and harm
Justice directed at offend- er, while victim is ignored	Offender, victim and school all have direct roles in justice process
Rules and intent outweigh whether outcome is positive/negative	Offender is responsible for harmful behavior, repairing harm and working toward a positive outcome
