Daylight Savings Time

Did you know that, today, <u>Daylight Saving Time</u> (DST) is used to save energy and make better use of

daylight? The idea has been suggested in ancient times and later by famous scientists. DST is a change in the standard time with the purpose of making better use of daylight and conserving energy.



Clocks are set ahead one hour when DST starts. This means

that the sunrise and sunset will be one hour later, on the clock, than the day before. Our clocks **Fall back** one hour on **Sunday, November 4, 2018**.

What's Happening In 4th and 5th Grade?

In 4th grade Math we wrapped up Unit 1 which focused on number sense, and we are moving into Unit 2 which focuses on multiplication and division. A great way to reinforce number sense is to take your child to the store and have him/her purchase a few items. While shopping, encourage him/her to compare prices to get the best deal, round up prices to

make sure he/she has enough money, and then add the prices up and subtract from the amount of money he/ she has to spend. In Science we are continuing to look at landforms and how ratcheting, erosion, and deposition shapes the earth. 4th graders are busy, as well in Reading and Social Studies. We are working with text structures in reading and learning about Ohio's historic



Native American tribes. Later this quarter, students will be creating their own expert magazine complete with five articles and all of the text features. Students will also dive into writing their own opinion articles. Students should continue to read nightly for 30 minutes with a family member.

5th Grade is excited about 2nd quarter! The Science Fair is approaching and we would like all students to have their topics selected before leaving for Thanksgiving break. Along with the Science Fair our focus in science for 2nd quarter will be Force and Motion. Language Arts will explore non-fiction standards and begin writing opinion pieces. Math will finish up multiplying and dividing with decimals and dive right into fractions. Social Studies classes will study early civilizations including the Mayas, Incas, Mississippians and the Aztec. We are looking forward to a fun-filled, interesting quarter full of problem solving and thought provoking topics that will challenge our students to be independent thinkers and thoughtful learners.

"RJ/RP" Corner—What is Restorative Justice?

"Restorative justice is an alternative approach to the traditional punishment-based methods that are used to manage behavior. Within schools, restorative practices, which are based on restorative justice principles, are being used to shift the focus on using exclusionary discipline solely (detentions, suspensions, expulsions) to the restoration and repair of harm and relationships. Firstly, restorative practices aim to build strong relationships between school staff, students, parents, and the larger community. Then, if misbehavior or harm occurs that affects these relationships, specific processes are taken to address the issues, develop resolutions, and make things right. It is also hoped that by using restorative approaches schools, over time, can significantly reduce school violence and bullying, contribute to social-emotional learning, maintain a positive school climate, and increase academic achievement.

Here at WBV, we have created a *restorative justice* room where students can come if they have a dispute that needs to be mediated, need help in coming up with ways to make things right, or just have a "cool down" moment. WBV staff is also learning how to be more restorative in their teaching practices, and some students have already participated in talking circles that focus on restorative conversations. In the near future, we look forward to working more with parents and the larger community as well, so that we all can be a part of making WBV a more restorative place to be!
