Project Overview

There is a lot our students can learn in school, but sometimes the most valuable knowledge is passed down from generation to generation. Join us in the creation of a Pittsburgh area Wisdom Corridor. Each school that participates in this project will have the opportunity to create their own unique Wisdom Corridor, which will be a part of the Pittsburgh Wisdom Corridor.

Using the Project FUEL framework and support, students will interview their parents, grandparents, teachers, fellow students, and other people in their community to document generations of wisdom and share it with others. Project FUEL will assist with the local project team to organize, compile, and highlight life lessons from each project site to incorporate into the final installation and documentation.

Students will work with their teachers to create their own Wisdom Corridor somewhere in the school. It could be in the hallway, a stairwell, a meeting place -- the goal is simply to create a space that is full of valuable wisdom passed on from the community. Each school will then be featured in a book that will be available at local libraries, schools and community centers throughout the Pittsburgh region.
