PROJECT OVERVIEW

- Reviewing the US 6 Corridor between the cities of Huron and Vermilion in Erie County.
- Reviewing 9.5 miles for multimodal considerations

PREVIOUS PROJECTS

Sandusky Bay Pathway

- Originally planned across Sandusky along waterfront
- Portions currently built or being expanded on in the city
- Planning efforts from Greater Sandusky Partnership (GSP) and local orgs look to grow pathway across MPO Region
- PID 117240 Pathway extension on east end of Huron one of two current extensions


US 6 Connectivity Corridor

- "Phase I"
- 6 new roundabouts, turn lane expansions, safety improvements and multimodal path between city of Sandusky and Huron
- Recipient of \$24.5 million in federal RAISE Funding
- Recipient of \$7.5 million in TRAC Funding
- Expands Sandusky Bay Pathway into Huron

Construction: SFY 2026-2028

Current Ellis Est: \$52 million

Western Bound: Heron Drive, Huron


Eastern Bound: W. River Road, Vermilion
