Important Notice: Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Instruction for Grades K-6

Dear District Families,

We hope this communication finds you in good health and enjoying a positive start to 2024. As part of our ongoing commitment to the safety and well-being of our students, we are writing to inform you about a new requirement beginning in the 2023-2024 school year.

In accordance with Ohio Revised Code 3313.60, E<u>rin's Law</u>, Ohio schools are now mandated to provide developmentally appropriate instruction in child sexual abuse prevention to students in grades K-6. This instruction will occur annually and includes information on available counseling and resources for children who may be victims of sexual abuse.

Key Points:

- 1. Annual Instruction: Child sexual abuse prevention instruction will take place annually for students in grades K-6.
- 2. Curriculum Selection: School Counselor(s) will deliver video-based curriculum developed by FightChildAbuse.org, an Ohio Department of Education and Workforce endorsed curriculum.
- 3. Lesson Schedule: Lessons will occur on April 15 and 22, 2024 during Social Studies class.
- 4. Opt-Out Option: Upon written request from a student's parent or guardian, the student shall be excused from taking instruction in child sexual abuse prevention. The deadline to opt-out is Friday, April 5, 2024.

It is important to note that the instruction and information provided will not be connected in any way to any individual, entity, or organization that provides, promotes, counsels, or makes referrals for abortion or abortion-related services.

We understand the sensitive nature of this topic, and our approach is designed to be developmentally appropriate for each grade level. The safety and well-being of our students remain our top priority.
