Spring Testing Season is ALMOST complete...

As you know, the past several weeks have been dedicated to the Spring administration of Ohio State Tests (OSTs) in English-Language Arts (3-5), Mathematics (3-5), and Science (5). These tests are so important because their results are what largely what populates our State Report Card and ratings as a school and district, which is why it is so important for students to perform their very best on them. This week we will be completing make-up testing due to student absences on an individual and group basis. In speaking with students, the overarching theme is that they felt prepared and confident on the testing days. I'm sure we can all expect some wonderful results we can be proud of!



Up this week is the Spring benchmarking with the NWEA MAP Assessment. Different from the OST testing we just completed, MAP is not an achievement test, but rather an adaptive, nationally normed assessment of students' growth relative to the common core state standards and skills in Reading and Math. The goal is always to show growth, which is relative and individualized for every student. However, it is no less important than the OST... These assessments

provide teachers and teams with invaluable data to make instructional decisions for grouping, interventions, enrichment opportunities, and more. Additionally, the MAP data is available within 24 hours of proctoring, and it automatically feeds into other platforms, like ExactPath for example, and creates a learning pathway that is specific to each learner. This way, students are always being met with what they need, whether that is gap-filling or acceleration to new skills where in either instance the content and skills may not be part of the normal curriculum at the student's grade level. Since we have all grown weary of being out of routine and testing schedules, we are running on a normal schedule and teachers will be testing their students in normal classes in Math and Reading this week. We will send family reports home so that you can see how much your student has grown this year with report cards by snail mail (USPS) in June.

Panorama Surveys

The district will be sending out the Panorama Survey to parents/families and it will be open until May 20. This is just a friendly reminder to please take the time to fill out the survey so that we can better serve your students. The administration analyzes this data each summer and uses it in planning and setting goals for the upcoming school year.

Annually, Bell Creek Intermediate participates in a night out at the Fifth-Third Field for a Dragon's game. This year, Mrs. Wellbaum and her choir



CROSSWALK & DROP-OFF/PICK-UP

Just some reminders for safety and efficiency's sake:

- The crosswalk is not supervised until 8:45 am and there is a staff member there to help students cross 8:45-9:00 each morning.
- In the afternoon, the crosswalk is supervised from 3:35-3:45.
- Students can enter the gym beginning at 8:45; that is when supervision duty begins. Please do not drop students off before then. They should not be waiting in the elements or playing on the playground as there is no outdoor supervision.





- Please remember at drop off and pick up to pull up all the way around the loop and stop in front of the playground near the SEC. This is what keeps traffic flowing efficiently and keeps our carline off the road.
- PAIRY SHED INFORMATION this was already sent out previously, but you can find it linked above. I have also been told that some of our students are behaving very badly (climbing on tables, hitting/shoving as mentioned above, etc.) not only does this reflect poorly on our school, it is also causing a nuisance for a local business, which is a hometown treasure. This is a privilege, which can be denied.

Requests for Placements in K-5 Classes

for Next School Year 2023-24

As you may know, our K-5 Team made the determination in the spring of last school year that it would no longer be feasible to consider parent/caregiver preferences for students' placements in their classes and we shared this with all families. This is a friendly reminder of this change in our scheduling protocols and procedures for both Stephen Bell and Bell Creek's academic programming and our service model needs. Aside from the wonderful opportunity to employ many more teachers in our elementary programs based on the generous hiring opportunity to decrease class sizes that prompted many changes and new teachers, there are several other factors that make including requests for placement an impossibility. While it is fantastic that so many of our teachers are highly regarded, respected, and their reputations carry such prestige in our school community and the community at large, and it is understandable why families may request them, there are other factors that can have far greater impacts on our placement to ensure that every student receives an appropriate and personalized learning experience in our schools based on their individual needs.

Our teams use a variety of data points as well as anecdotal information and input from your students' current teacher(s) to help determine placement priorities for each one of them as we plan for next school year. As students progress in their educational journeys into second grade and beyond, the academic rigor along with more specific academic needs begin to need to be addressed. The specific services, programs, and personnel who provide the academic intervention or enrichment in conjunction with homeroom teachers delivering the core curriculum, make for a very intricate schedule in our buildings. Adding the additional variable of preference for placement is something we can no longer do. Please know that we consider many different pieces of data and other factors to ensure that students are placed most appropriately where the staff can best serve them, where they can be successful, and where reach their fullest potential.
