HOME IS AT THE HEART OF THE HOLIDAYS

Bellbrook Schools are the heart of the Bellbrook community. Each year Bellbrook students go above and beyond in order to help support Bellbrook-Sugarcreek and the greater Dayton region by raising money, collecting goods, volunteering their time, and donating the gift of life during our blood drive. This is especially important during the holiday season. We are extremely proud of their generosity and dedication to our hometown!

This year the **Class of 2026** coordinated the yearly teacher turkey contest and donated the proceeds to the to Unverferth House on the Ohio State campus. Unverferth House was a temporary home away from home for a heart



transplant patient and their BHS family at the OSU Wexner Medical Center this fall. **National Honor Society** volunteered at Christmas in the Park and also raised money through a bake sale to support the community resource center. Our **HOSA** chapter held its Winter Blood Drive on December 5th. BHS Students and staff donated 52 units of blood. Each donation can save up to three lives. **GSA Pride & Diversity Club** held a food drive for Daybreak Dayton and teamed with "The Other TP" to provide feminine hygiene products and candy for David's Place, which provides emergency housing for LGBTQ youth. **Mrs. Enderson's room** collected cat and dog food, treats, toys, blankets, collars, and leashes and donated them to the Greene County Animal Shelter in their annual Santa Paws drive. **The Kindness Club** collected food for the (continued on page 2)

All students are to attend school for the entire period in which they have an exam. Students can not leave school until the end of the exam period. If students finish prior to the end of the period they should use that time to study for their additional exams.

An exam grade is worth 20% of the student's grade for a semester course and 10% for a year-long course. An unexcused absence during an exam period will result in a failing grade for the exam.

Absences not previously approved by the office will only be excused with a doctor's note. Please make sure students attend their exams.

Students only need to be in school during periods that they have an exam. After they have completed their final exam period of the day they can scan out using the QR codes by the doors. If your student wants to stay at school or cannot get a ride they must attend study hall. The buses will run at their normal times. Lunch will be provided for those who need it from 12:45-1:25 in the cafeteria.

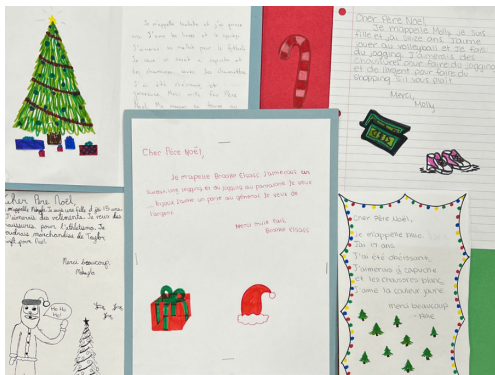

WORLD LANGUAGES

French 1 just started their unit on Qui suis-je where they'll learn to communicate about what they and other people are like.

French 2 recently started their next unit on Noël. They will be analyzing authentic resources while learning about Christmas traditions of francophone countries. They recently wrote letters to Pere Noël asking for gifts ranging from pets, jewelry, clothes, shoes, and a Range Rover! They also enjoyed a mini bûche de Noël (yule log cake). **French 3** has started their 3rd unit where they will be learning advanced narrative techniques while

exploring clothing more in depth through song analysis. **French 4** just finished their creative writing on a Parisian weekend get-away. They used prior knowledge and researched locations to create their perfect weekend escape to places such as la Tour Eiffel, le Stade de France, and the Galeries Lafayette for shopping.



Spanish 1 has been busy preparing for Semester Exams. We have discussed everything from school, to how to describe ourselves & others, to our favorite things to do... ¡todo en español! We've learned about different traditions & celebrations from around the Spanish-speaking world; like the Night of the Radishes (la Noche de Rábanos) in Mexico and the National Lottery (El Gordo) in Spain. **Spanish 2** Is working on reflexive verbs in Spanish to

talk about their daily routines. **Spanish 3** is finishing up a unit on staying in shape and recommendations to live a healthy lifestyle. They did this using commands, both formal and informal and the subjunctive mood. **Spanish 4** is learning about how the world stays connected by means of communication, press, movies and more. They are currently writing a newspaper in the target language. **Spanish 5** just completed a unit on legends and the importance of a legend in Latin America. They are now creating their own legend.

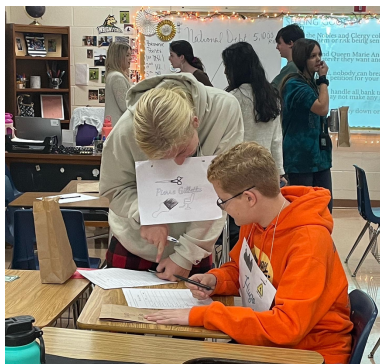
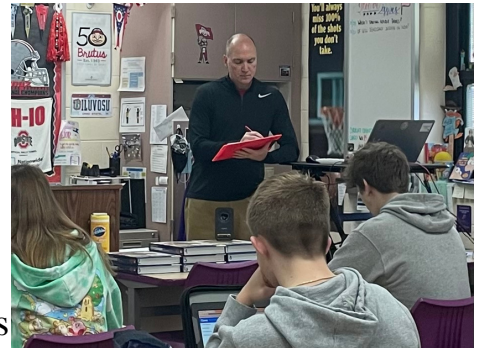
SOCIAL STUDIES

The Bellbrook High School Social Studies department and its students have consistently performed at the highest levels on both Ohio End of Course and Advanced Placement tests. Last year was no exception. BHS's performance on the EOC test was ranked at the top of school districts most like Bellbrook across the state (Government #6 and US History #1).

In **Advanced Placement US History**, students have been studying early American history this semester and just completed a unit focusing on Abraham Lincoln, The Civil War, and Reconstruction. Students in **American Studies** have been focusing on American history from US Industrialization through the end of World War I. Students taking **World Studies** have completed an overview of world history beginning with the Enlightenment period and are now finishing units on World War I.

Students taking **American Government** or **AP Government** at BHS have been studying the foundations of American government and the development of the two-party system.

In **Psychology**, students have learned about the brain's processes for memory by reviewing storage, encoding, and retrieval systems. They have also learned about theories of consciousness and the science behind sleep. Featuring the theories of Sigmund Freud and biological psychologists, students have also explored the phenomenon of dreams and how science continues to



attempt to explain this intriguing experience.

Students have numerous other topics to explore including: current events in **American and Global Issues**, the social aspects of human life in **Sociology**, and the **History of Rock & Roll** and its connection to American political, social, and economic history.

The BHS Music Department went right from a busy, successful marching band season to what will continue to be a busy time for them, with Indoor Percussion Ensemble, Winter Guard, Pep Band, and Jazz Band just getting started. This year's Indoor Percussion show is titled "The Forbidden Forest," featuring music by Grieg and other classical composers. This year's Open Winter Guard show will be revealed soon!

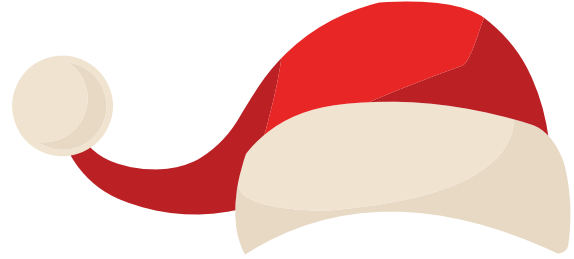

PSAT Results

Student scores from the October PSAT/NMSQT will be available online Dec 5-6. You can pick up your PSAT booklet from Mrs. Scohy's office if you want it. Students who provided their email addresses on their PSAT/NMSQT answer sheet will receive an email reminder from College Board explaining where and how to view their scores. Students should set up a free College Board account [here](#). Use these videos to help you interpret your scores. In addition, we strongly encourage students to link their College Board account to Khan Academy. Students will be able to get individualized SAT practice by uploading your PSAT results [here](#).

PE Waivers

A list of students who earned a PE waiver from Fall sports was sent to the counseling office from the athletic department. As a reminder, the PE waiver is available to students in grades 9-12 participating in BHS Interscholastic Sports, Cheerleading, the Marching Band and JROTC. Students must successfully complete 2 full-seasons in one or more qualifying activities from the same area (ie: cannot mix 1 year of JROTC and 1 season of a sport). Once completed, the two PE waivers will waive the PE graduation requirement. The PE waiver does not count for a credit and the grade is marked as a "P". Students cannot mix a PE class and a PE waiver.
