Information, Reports, and Recommendations

A. Ms. Sarah Beth Cox, Director of Career & Technical Education and Ms. Deanna Wiles, Director of K-12 Curriculum & Instruction shared a presentation recapping the following Summer Opportunities that were offered, listed below.

<u>Read to Achieve Summer Reading Camp</u> – This was a three-week summer camp offered targeted literacy instruction and intervention to second and third grade students who had not demonstrated proficiency in literacy. 75 students attended this camp at Guy B. Teachey Elementary School. The students were taught engaging, targeted literacy instruction and focused on vocabulary building.

<u>CTE Career Accelerator Grant</u> – This grant is to help "fund high-quality, evidence-based learning and workforce aligned summer programs (NCDPI)". The CTE camps were possible because of this grant.

<u>District C Summer Teamship</u> – This is an internship experience with teams that solve real problems for real businesses. This internship experience is for high school students, and 13 students participated.

<u>Health Science Camp</u> – This camp was for rising 6th-9th graders, and 12 students participated. The camp included hands-on learning, and the students visited Randolph Hospital, the Department of Nanoscience and Engineering at A&T, and the Orthopedics department at Pfeifer University.

Agriculture Camp – This camp was for rising 6th-9th graders, and eight students participated. The camp was a farm-to-table experience, and they had a field trip every day. They visited Whitaker Farms, the Agriculture business program at Randolph Community College, among other businesses. **Minecraft & Robotics Camp** – This camp was for rising 6th-9th graders, and 22 students participated. Students learned coding skills in both camps. Minecraft was the most popular camp.

<u>**Girls in STEM Camp**</u> – This camp was for rising 6^{th} - 9^{th} graders, and 14 students participated. This camp is designed to encourage girls to pursue careers in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

<u>CTE Summer Internships</u> – This was for high school students, and 19 students participated. Some of the businesses that allowed the students to intern were Trogdon Daycare, Atalys, Asheboro Landscaping, ACS Maintenance, and Mt. Shepherd. The students got paid for the internship.

B. Dr. Wendy Rich, Chief Academic Officer/Assistant Superintendent and Ms. Chandra Manning, Director of Communications & Talent Development shared an update on the Teacher and School Leader (TSL) Grant. The grant was awarded to The Innovation Project (TIP) and we are one of eight school districts participating in this grant. The TSL grant will work to help reset how instructional facilitators are used so work is focused on increasing teacher effectiveness and student achievement. The grant funded two lead teacher positions: Innovation (PreK-12) and Math (6-12). The grant also allows for eight Lab Classroom Leaders: Michelle Race (Balfour), Rebecca Kidd (McCrary), Danielle Hunter (Loflin), Hannah Lawton (Teachey), Jada Hazlett (Lindley Park), Chrystal Haigler (NAMS), Betsy Hammond (SAMS) and Lori Columbia (AHS). These teachers will serve as a model for equitable, rigorous, and effective instruction in their schools.
