## Nick Carr

Nick Carr is a distinguished athlete and scholar whose wrestling career has left a lasting legacy. A graduate of Washington &

Jefferson College with a degree in Communication Arts, Nick also showcased his leadership as the Vice President of the NCAA Student-Athlete Advisory Committee.

At South Fayette High School, Nick excelled both on and off the mat. He compiled a remarkable 128-17 record, securing three WPIAL Class AA championships and a PIAA Class AA state title during his junior year. He also placed second in the state championships as a senior and fifth as a sophomore. Ranked No. 10 in the nation among 145-pound wrestlers, Nick's wrestling talent was widely recognized. Off the mat, he served as President of the Library Club and was a member of the National Honor Society, reflecting his dedication to academics and leadership.

Nick continued his wrestling success at Kent State with a 21-10 record as a redshirt freshman at 149 pounds. However, his most notable achievements came at Washington & Jefferson College. In 2015, Nick made history by becoming the first wrestling national champion for W&J, winning the NCAA Division III 157-pound championship with a perfect 27-0 season.

Nick concluded his career at W&J with a 41-1 record, with his only loss occurring in the 2014 national championship match. He also claimed two PAC titles and was named a CoSIDA Academic All-American.

Currently, Nick is a Project Manager for NAI Burns Scalo Real Estate & Construction Services, where he continues to demonstrate the dedication and excellence that marked his athletic career.
