## Christian Brumbaugh

By the time Christian Brumbaugh finished his career as a quarterback at South Fayette High School in 2011, he was the Western Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic League's (WPIAL) all-time passing leader with 7,164 career yards. He threw 88 touchdown passes during his career.

Christian also set the WPIAL single-season records for passing with 3,726 yards and 52 touchdown passes. In his senior year, he set a Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association (PIAA) record with 52 touchdown passes. Christian was also selected as a team captain in both his junior and senior years. He was a two-time first-team All-Century Conference selection and league MVP in 2009 and 2010 and those same two years he was also an All-State selection, *Post-Gazette* Fabulous 22 player, *Tribune-Review* Terrific 25 player, and *Observer-Reporter* Player of the Year. In his senior year he was honored as WPIAL AA Player of the Year and the Pennsylvania Football News AA Player of the Year. He was also the recipient of the 2010-11 WPIAL Scholar/Athlete Award. Christian led the Lions to back-to-back undefeated regular seasons as a junior and senior. As a senior, he lead South Fayette to the WPIAL AA Championship and the PIAA State AA Championship at Hershey Park. The team ended their season as WPIAL AA Champs and PIAA State Runner-Up.

As a basketball player, Christian started as a forward his junior and senior years. He helped guide the team to win the school's first PIAA State Championship in 2009, as a junior. In 2010, as a senior, Christian and the basketball team were WPIAL AAA Runners-up. Outside of athletics, Christian won numerous academic awards including being a member of National Honor Society, consistently on Highest Honor Roll, and the SAT Math Award. He was active in the community by serving as a volunteer for the Oakridge Fire Department, volunteer at St Barbara's Catholic Church, member of Teen Institute, and SF Preschool Big Helper.

He went on to accept a full scholarship for football as a quarterback at the College of William and Mary. He was selected for the 2014 Coastal Athletic Association (CAA) Academic All-Conference Team and was a consistent member of the Dean's List. He graduated from the Mason School of Business with a Major in Finance, a concentration in process management and consulting and a minor in math. During his time at William and Mary, he served as the president of Sigma Mu Sigma Service fraternity, volunteered as a mentor to local elementary school children and was a member of the Sports Business Club and the Finance Academy.

Since college, Christian has enjoyed a blossoming professional career in investment banking. He currently serves as a Vice President at Harris Williams where he advises clients on mergers and acquisitions and other strategic advisory assignments including divestitures, financings, and capital raisings.

Christian and his wife, Amanda, live in Richmond, Virginia. They met at the College of William in Mary where Amanda was a successful lacrosse player. They have a 2-year-old daughter, Barrett.
