SFTSD Introduces the "South Fayette Way"

With the launch of the 2024-25 academic year, South Fayette is introducing the "South Fayette Way" in all four school buildings, a program based on the principles of PBIS: Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports.

The purpose of PBIS is to foster a positive school environment through clear expectations, positive reinforcement, and consistent consequences. Teachers and staff are taking a proactive approach to establishing the behavioral supports needed for students to achieve social, emotional, and academic success. Students have the opportunity to understand expectations and receive regular recognition for success as opposed to only punishment for behavioral failures. Each school will have its own age-appropriate structure for recognizing achievement. The goal is that the core principles of being safe, kind, and responsible will be instilled in students through daily interactions and lessons.


Coming Home: SF Calendars and Magnets

As Campus Renovations Occur, Stay Current Online

Currently, the School Board and District Administration are discussing three renovation projects for our campus including additions to the Intermediate School, relocation of the Bus Depot, and construction of a new Elementary School which will include demolition of the current structure. These discussions are held during public school board meetings on Tuesday evenings.

Special Funding to Grow Youth Hockey in SF

The South Fayette Hockey Association is excited to share that, through the generosity of a local family, they are able to reduce this year's fees to make it more affordable for families and kids to fall in love with ice hockey. The family's donation of \$15,000 to the Jr. Lions program reduces fees for the 2024-2025 season from \$875 to \$300. Additionally, the donating family is providing free gear/ equipment (\$400 value) to the first seven kids who register for the program and are new to the sport. Their donation was provided to help make youth hockey more



accessible and to help grow the next generation of Middle School, JV, and Varsity hockey players for South Fayette.

The Jr. Lions Program is for kids in Kindergarten through Middle School (8U, 10U, and 12U). Prior experience with hockey and skating is not required. Hockey season runs from September to March, with one-weekend evening practice per week and 10 to 15 games, all local to Pittsburgh. Other activities include a free group outing to an away South Fayette Varsity hockey game and/or an RMU Colonials hockey game (pending game schedules), a holiday party/family skate, and a season-end coaches vs. kids game. STEAM Camps Were Hot this Summer at SF

With an Intermediate STEAM Camp held in the mornings and an Elementary STEAM Camp in the afternoons, the South Fayette Summer STEAM Camps offered an exciting array of activities designed to inspire and educate young minds this summer through hands-on projects and experiments.

The Intermediate STEAM Camp buzzed with activity as students delved into the fascinating world of rocketry. They built and launched straw rockets and two-liter bottle rockets, learning about aerodynamics and propulsion. They also learned principles of force and motion through engineering projects in which they constructed balloon cars and sail cars from recycled materials and engaged in designing carnival games using catapults to launch ping pong balls and cotton balls into targets. Their carnival games expanded to incorporate a foundational understanding of electrical circuits. The creation of straw roller coasters further demonstrated the principles of physics, encouraging teamwork and problem-solving as students worked together to perfect their designs.



The Elementary STEAM Camp focused on different themes, blending scientific exploration with imaginative projects. The young campers learned about bats, constructing paper airplane "bats" and bat boxes from recycled materials. This activity not only taught them about these fascinating creatures but also highlighted the importance of conservation. Their focus also expanded to weather and natural disasters with examinations of sun protection and meteorology. Lastly, fairy tales met STEAM in a series of creative problem-solving activities using upcycled materials to devise solutions to various fairy tale dilemmas.

By the end of the camps, students had developed a deeper appreciation for STEAM and are poised to make significant contributions to the world in the years to come. Thank you to **Mr. Wachter** for serving as the annual STEAM Camp Director; **Mr. Kuglar, Mr. Coyne,** and **Ms. Kucerovy** for leading

our Intermediate STEAM Camp; as well as **Ms. Yakish, Mrs. Colangelo,** and **Ms. Slattery** for teaching the Elementary STEAM camp sessions.

New Summer Program Helped Participants Chill

This was the first summer for the AHN Chill Project Summer Program™ at South Fayette and it was held at the Middle School. The 4-day program was designed to combine a fun and exciting curriculum with emotional wellness concepts for children entering grades 1 - 6, and was offered for five weeks with a different theme each week. Kristy Frohliger, Behavioral Health School Educator at the Middle School, was the Summer Program Director, and all programs were run by skilled educators in the mental health and education fields.

In addition to positive, growth exercises and discussions, registrants kept busy with arts and crafts, sports, and exciting visits from local community members such as SF Library, Millie's Homemade Ice Cream, and the Drone Academy. Registration for next summer's program is expected to begin in January 2025.


