# ALL STUDENTS ARE RECOMMENDED TO READ 4 BOOK OVER THE SUMMER

**Students who read 5 or more books** on their reading level and score 80% on an AR test or complete a summary reading log for all 5 books will be eligible to attend our Summer Reading Celebration, held during the first few weeks of school, as well as two additional rewards.

**Students who read 4 books** on their reading level and score 80% on an AR test or complete a summary reading log for all 4 books will be eligible to attend our Summer Reading Celebration, held during the first few weeks of school, as well as one additional reward.

**Students who read 3 books** on their reading level and score 80% on an AR test or complete a summary reading log for all 3 books will be eligible to attend our Summer Reading Celebration, held during the first few weeks of school.
