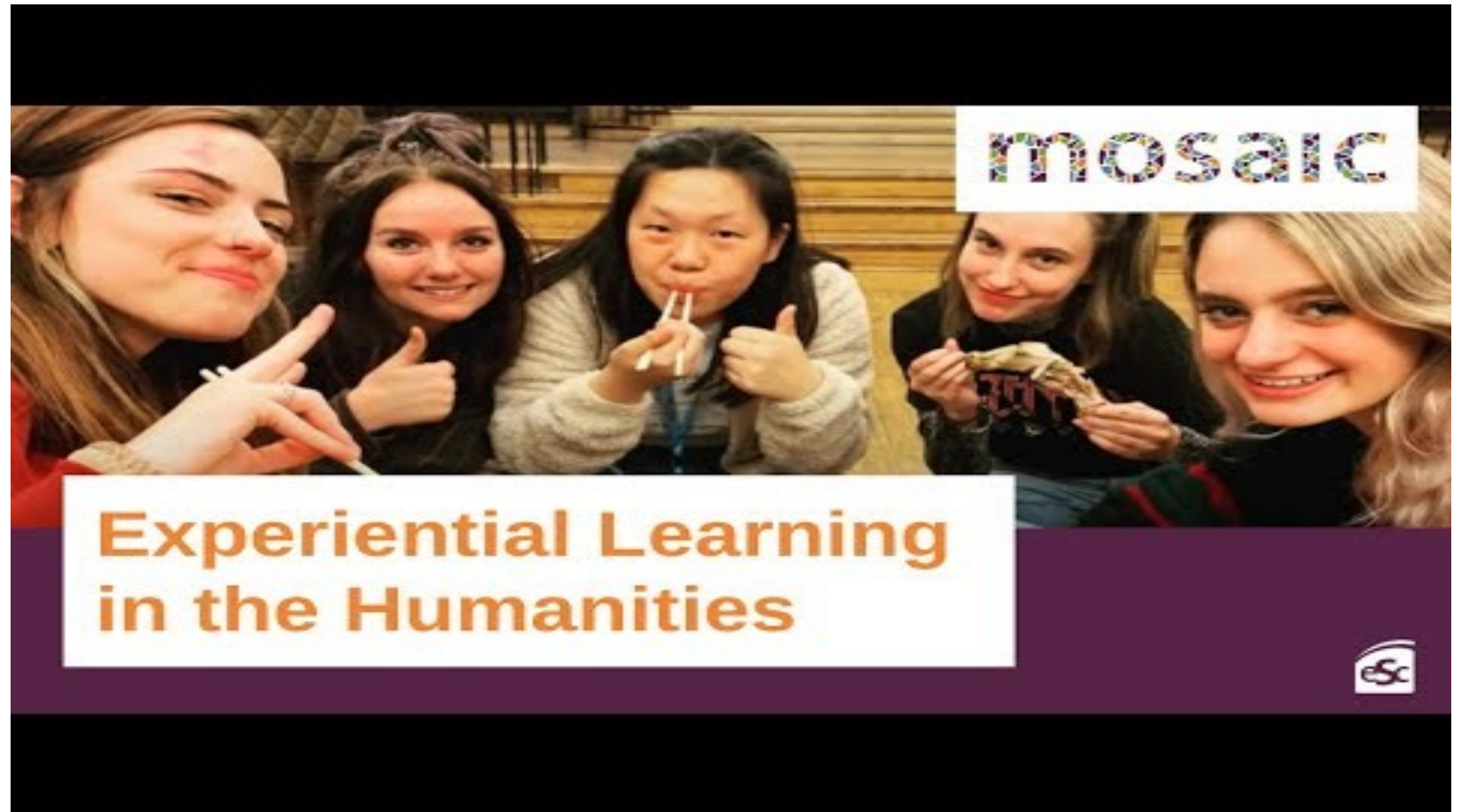

### Excerpt from the 17 Principles:

5. We believe in individual solutions rather than one-size-fits-all rules.

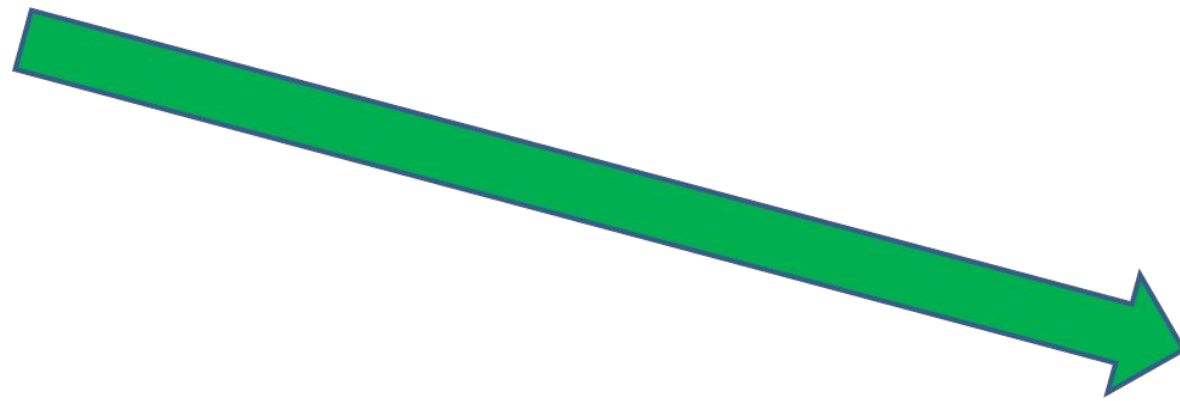
# Application Process

- **December 2021**- Marketing and approach school counselors for possible perspective students
- **January 10-28, 2022**- Recruitment meeting at consortium high schools by a Mosaic facilitator.
- **February 2022**- Parent open house, application due
- **March 2022**- Student interviews March 1-18
  - Decisions letters sent to students by April 1
- **April 2022**- Await final acceptance by students and inform school counselors
- **May 2022**- Ice Cream Social 2022-2023 cohorts
