


Mosaic History and Philosophy

- Program created in 1990 by the Franklin County Educational Council as a result of the 1987 Win-Win Agreement among the Central Ohio school districts.

- Mosaic is an integrated, project-based humanities program that incorporates social studies, English, the arts and cultural studies.

- Mosaic utilizes a student-directed, collaborative approach that incorporates global perspectives and creative problem-solving.

Utilizing inquiry-based methodologies to facilitate college readiness, Mosaic prides itself on celebrating each student by creating a community that supports and encourages every voice in the room. Students will also focus on "real world" skills needed to succeed beyond graduation such as collaborative and leadership skills, as well as internship and Capstone project skills. 5. We believe in individual solutions rather than one-




Application Process

- **December 2021** Marketing and approach school counselors for possible perspective students
- January 10-28, 2022 Recruitment meeting at consortium high schools by a Mosaic facilitator.
- February 2022 Parent open house, application due
- March 2022- Student interviews March 1-18
 - Decisions letters sent to students by April 1
- April 2022 Await final acceptance by students and inform school counselors
- May 2022- Ice Cream Social 2022-2023 cohorts




Application & Letters of Recommendation
