Triennial Assessment and Recordkeeping Requirements for the Local School Wellness Policy

- The Pennsylvania Department of Education requires Local Education Agencies (LEA) participating in the National School Lunch & Breakfast Programs to have an up-to-date wellness policy that meets the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010.
- Part of this process requires the LEA to complete a wellness assessment of the LEA's school wellness policy once every three years and to make the results public.
- The triennial assessment measures the LEA's compliance with the wellness policy, a comparison with model school wellness policies, and a description of the progress made in achieving the goals of the policy.
- The assessment tool focuses on public involvement, nutrition education and promotion, physical activity and education, other school-based wellness activities and nutrition guidelines for all food and beverages at the school.
- The LEA is responsible for forming a wellness committee to permit participation from the community to help develop, implement, review, and update the wellness policy.
- South Fayette Township School District will need to complete the triennial assessment by June 30, 2022.

Deadlines and Actions of the Committee

- The wellness committee has met on January 27, 2022 and March 31, 2022 to discuss the process of completing the triennial assessment and future goals of the committee. These two meetings met the requirements of two meetings per school term.
- An additional meeting is scheduled for May 26, 2022 and the committee will schedule a meeting quarterly to meet and exceed requirements.
- The focus of re-establishing the wellness committee was to complete the triennial assessment requirements.
- Updates have been made to the District's wellness policy and the policy was submitted to PSBA for review.
- Triennial assessments have been completed and are ready to be posted on the District website to meet the June 30, 2022 deadline.
