MUSIC-MS. LEE

In January, the 4k and 5k students will learn the difference between high and low notes and about music that goes up and down. The 1st and 2nd graders will identify the forms of music. The 3rd graders will sing rounds with their class. Finally, the 4th and 5th graders will learn about the sixteenth note and review the quarter note, half note, and whole note.
