### FUNDING MECHANISM

The Erie County Solid Waste Management District allocates \$20,000 annually for managing all types of waste (“debris”) resulting from a disaster or significant emergency. The funding is only available after an Emergency Declaration has been made by the Board of Commissioners of Erie County where the disaster took place. The Board of the Erie County Solid Waste Management District is not required to call a special session of the Board to activate the funding.
