

Bexley is a strongly supported and well-funded landlocked community with limited opportunities for the district to purchase additional land. The Cassingham Complex sits on 14 acres of land and houses Cassingham Elementary, Bexley MS, Bexley HS, and BHS athletic facilities. Residential homes surround this parcel of land.

The timeline for building construction began in 1929 when the Bexley City School District built the Cassingham Elementary and Junior High School on the north end of the property in central Bexley. Two years later, in 1931, Bexley Schools built the new Bexley High School and its outdoor athletic facilities on the south end of the property. In 1971, the middle school expansion project connected Bexley High School with Cassingham Elementary and Junior High forming one building. In 2002, further acreage of this property was absorbed due to an addition to the Cassingham Complex.

We seek a firm with creative vision and experience to help us develop a Master Facilities Plan that includes a pathway to the future by creating a long-term renewal vision for the Cassingham Complex, and the school district overall. Please provide an example(s) to help us understand how you have assisted similar landlocked school districts by creating a long-term renewable facility use and growth pathway.
