- Weekly social emotional class (SEL) on topics including: Kindness, Respect, Responsibility, Gratitude, Empathy, Perseverance, Honesty, Cooperation, Courage, & Creativity
- Small Group Counseling
- Individual Short Term Counseling
- Parent Consultation
- Collaboration with Staff
- Crisis Response
- Referrals to outside agencies: including basic needs and mental health resources.





Ways to Help Your Child Prepare for Kindergarten

- Practice self care skills (bathroom, putting on coat, zipping, tying, organizing materials and space, cleaning up after self)
- Build in child responsibilities and independence at home (clear table, get self dressed)
 - Listening to others
- Taking turns, sharing, honesty (play board games together, practice being a good sport)
- Normalizing mistakes (it is ok to make mistakes, what can we learn from what happened?)
 - Naming feelings (I feel _____, because of _____.)
 - Problem solving strategies (say the problem, think of solutions)
- Establish a healthy sleep schedule and daily routine (10-12 hours of sleep a night, we do not have nap)

- Monday, August 18th - all K students together



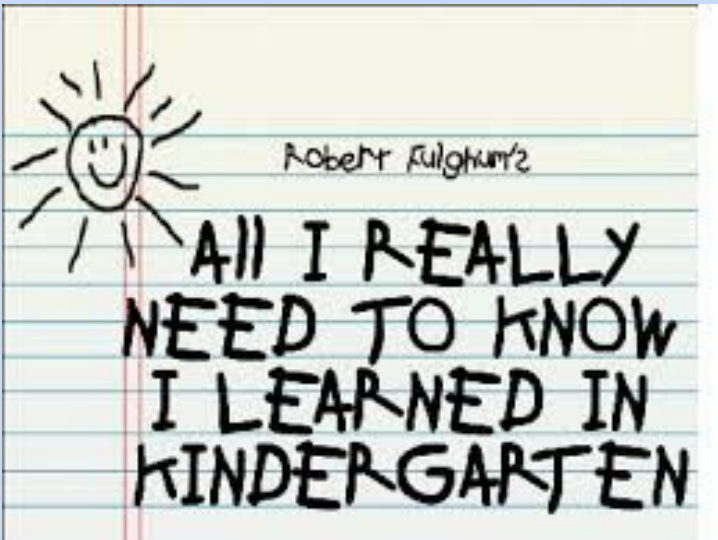
