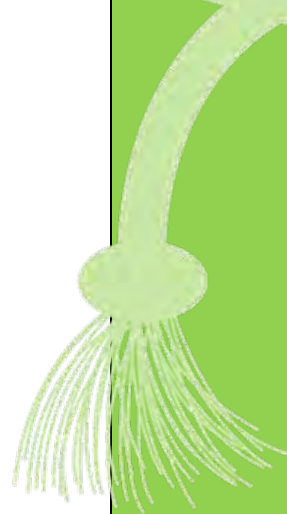




PARTICIPATION

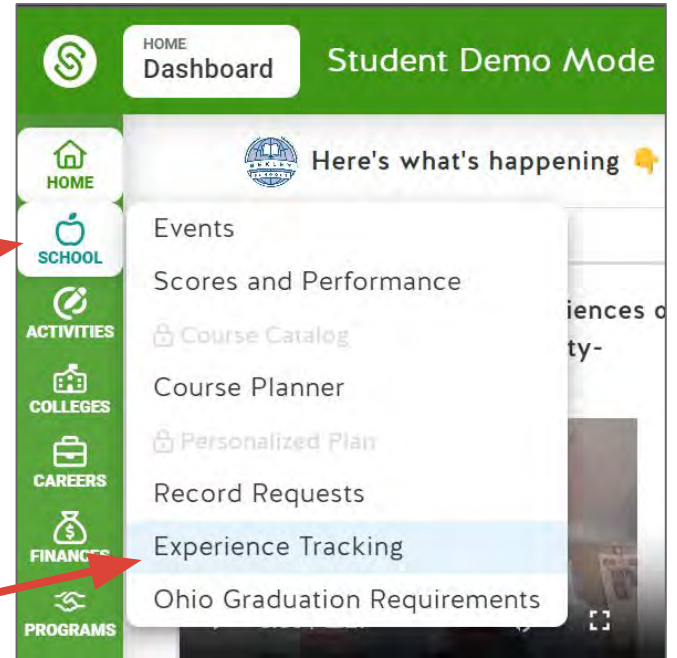



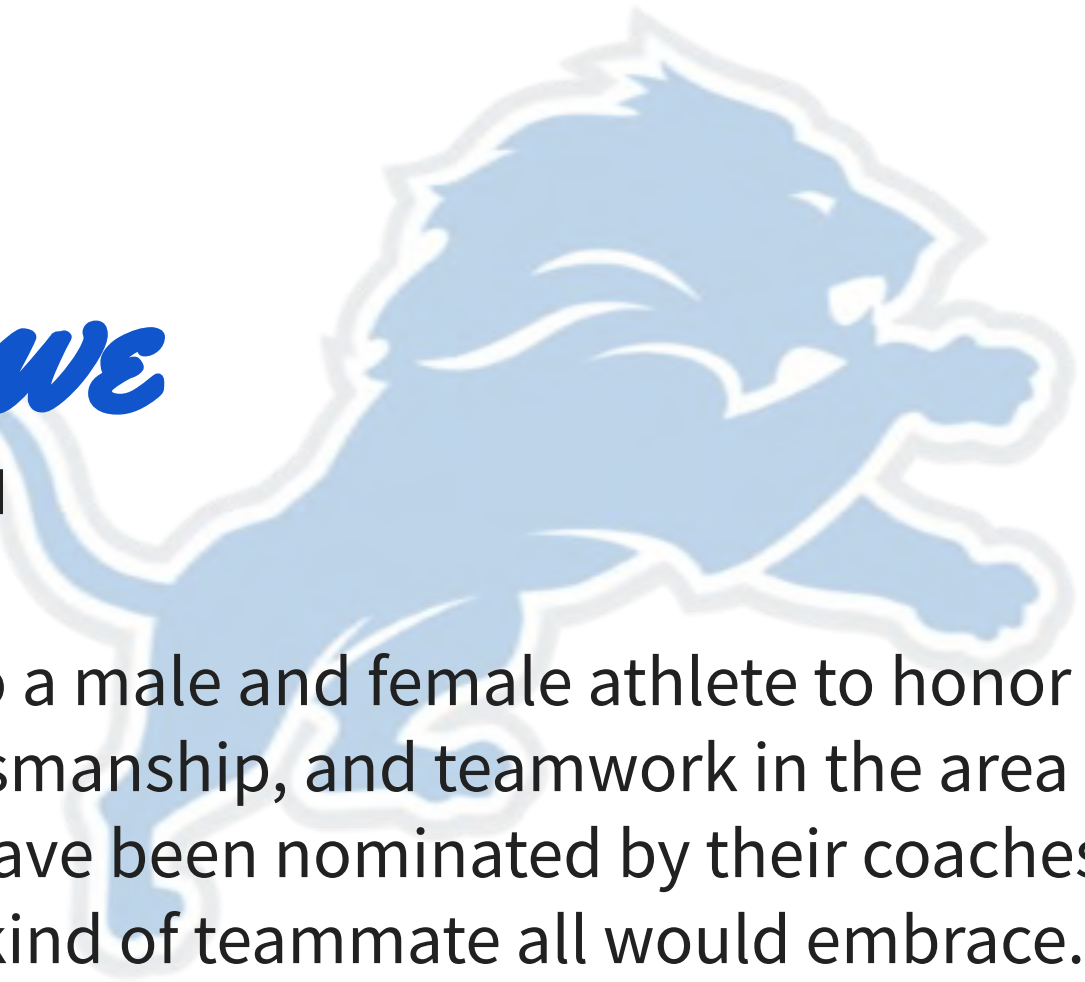
