Brentwood Dukes Leon Markwood Aid to Education Award



To be eligible you must have:

- 1. A minimum of three (3) years of participation in the Dukes program.
- 2. Your final year must have been as a thirteen- or fourteen-year-old.
- 3. You must continue your education after graduating from high school.
- 4. To be considered for the award, you must write a one-page essay on how the years as a Brentwood "Duke" played a part in your life.

Eligible seniors are notified by Mrs. Klein.

Brentwood Education Association (BEA) Scholarship





Each year, the Brentwood Education Association awards a \$1,000 scholarship to a graduating senior who plans to pursue a college degree in teaching or other education-related field.



If the applications do not conform to the standards required of future educators in terms of appearance, spelling, grammar and complete answers, this scholarship may <u>not</u> be awarded to any applicant this year.



Brentwood High School Alumni Association Scholarship



The Brentwood High School Alumni Association has been in existence to support alumni relations spanning all graduating classes. The Brentwood High School Alumni Association has been sponsoring an annual scholarship for Brentwood High School seniors since 2017. They have been a valued partner of Brentwood High School by supporting graduating seniors.

Must have a GPA of 3.0 or better.

Continuation of studies at an accredited institution.

Application and essay are required.

Monetary award.

Brentwood High School Hall of Fame Scholarship Award

All Brentwood High School seniors who plan to enroll at Community College of Allegheny County (CCAC) or a vocational or technical school are eligible for the award.

Application and short essay required.

The Brentwood High School Hall of Fame scholarship is a monetary award and the criteria for distribution is outlined in the application.

Brentwood High School Musical Scholarship



Eligibility Requirements:

- 1. A graduating senior from the Brentwood Class of 2025.
- 2. The senior has participated in the Musical all four (4) years of high school, including the current production.
- 3. Have a cumulative GPA of 3.o.
- 4. Must be continuing your education at an accredited 2- or 4-year institution.

Application and essay are required.

Brentwood Historical Society Helen Owens Memorial **Scholarship**



In 2015 the Brentwood Historical Society offered the "Believe in Brentwood" Centennial Award to the Class of 2015 in celebration of the Borough of Brentwood's 100th anniversary.

Each year since, the Historical Society has sponsored an essay contest open to Brentwood High School seniors.

This year's essay contest asks members of the Class of 2025 to write a response to the following: What is the best thing about living in Brentwood?

Application and essay are required.

Brentwood Lions Club Scholarship





Sponsored by the Brentwood Lions Club. Awarded to a Brentwood senior who exhibits a commitment to serve his/her community.



Applicants should have a proven commitment to community; volunteering/assisting others.

Award must be used for post-secondary education.



Brian Lydon Memorial Scholarship



The Brian Lydon Memorial Scholarship was established in memory of Brian Lydon, Elroy Elementary Principal and Moore Elementary teacher. Brian Lydon was an accomplished educator, valued colleague, and a good friend to many within the Brentwood Borough School District as well as the Brentwood community. The recipient of this award is one who possesses great character and who desires to become an elementary educator.

The scholarship will be awarded to a Brentwood High School senior who plans to study elementary education at a college/university upon graduation.

Applicants will be judged based on academics and extracurricular activities, as well as a short essay.

Elroy PTA Scholarship



The Elroy PTA is pleased to offer a scholarship award to a member of the Brentwood High School Class of 2025 who is also a graduate of Elroy Elementary School. The recipient of this award must use the funds to help further his or her post-secondary education.

Applicant must be a 2025 graduate of Brentwood High School and a graduate of Elroy Elementary School.

The funds must be used for post-secondary education.

Application and essay are required.

George Radosevich Scholar-Athlete Award



The George Radosevich Scholar-Athlete Award is offered by the family of Mr. George Radosevich.

Mr. Radosevich was a three-sport star at Brentwood High School. At Pitt he lettered in football, track and basketball. In 1951, he won the Athletic Committee Award, given annually to the university's best athlete in any sport. He played professional football for the Steelers and the Colts. For the next four decades, Coach Radosevich taught and coached at Brentwood High School. He was beloved and respected by all that knew him.

Enrollment - Student must be enrolled and participating in interscholastic athletics at Brentwood High School.

Senior Status - Student must be a senior graduating during the current school year.

Varsity Letter - Student must have, prior to senior year, won a varsity letter in a sport.

3.0 GPA - Student must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.

Collegiate athletics – Student must be continuing his/her athletic career at a four-year college/university.

Application, short answer questions, essay, and two letters of recommendation are required.

Thomas P. Kapfer Memorial Scholarship



Born in 1958, Thomas Kapfer attended Brentwood High School where he was a member of the National Honor Society and winner of the 1976 Mark Ryder award for leadership. After graduation, he enrolled at Duquesne University where he majored in finance and was known as a relentlessly hard worker. Thomas was lost in a tragic automobile accident. His family and friends have sponsored this scholarship since his passing. Today the Thomas P. Kapfer Memorial Fund honors that same compassion and humility by awarding an annual scholarship to a graduating senior based on leadership, academic achievement, and an "extraordinary concern" for others.
