

WHAT HAS CHANGED?

PDE has required districts to complete an attestation form stating that they will abide by DOH and PDE regulations regarding mandated school closures.

Districts were given two options:

- Remain hybrid and agree to close when specific conditions were met
- Go fully online

All public PreK-12 school entities in counties with substantial transmission for at least two consecutive weeks must submit the [Attestation Form](#), even if the entity does not intend to offer any in-person instruction.



A public PreK-12 school entity in a county with two consecutive weeks of substantial transmission that does not return a completed and signed attestation ~~must provide in-person instruction, but rather, may provide only fully~~

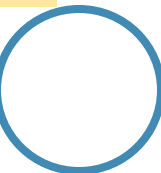

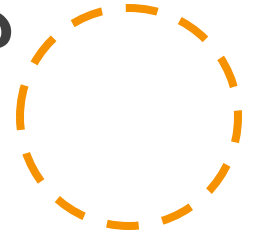

*** If case investigations, contact tracing and cleaning and disinfecting can be accomplished in a faster time frame, the length of the closure time may be shortened.**



WHAT HAPPENS IF A THRESHOLD IS MET?



School Reopens

Students return to their original hybrid learning model; the 14 day window resets

Threshold met

Building will close for the required duration of time necessary to contact trace, clean and disinfect



Online Learning

During the closure all students will use their district issued Chromebook and Canvas classroom to access schooling and instruction



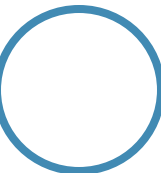
School closes

Families will be notified via a Skylert message about the school closure duration



Area(s) School Cleaning

Custodial staff will do a through cleaning of the affected area(s) and/or school





WHAT HAS CHANGED?

Every student in the district has a device reserved for their use.

Devices were distributed to families on 12/7, 12/8, & 12/9.


Devices will be used both online and in the classroom.

- Students attending in person must bring the charged device with them to school daily.
- When online, all work must be submitted through the device; paper copies will not be available.

- This is also recognizes that there was a surge in cases over Thanksgiving break and gives families additional time to plan.



The Learning Models

HYBRID AND FULLY ONLINE



HYBRID LEARNING

Families chose to either attend in person or attend online.

- K – 5 Fully online 5 days a week
- K – 2 Students attend 4 days a week in-person; 1 day online
- 3 – 5 Students attend 2 days a week in-person; 3 days online

Work is submitted via Canvas for online days.

Attendance is taken by responding to an attendance question and completing required work for the day.

Fully asynchronous learning.

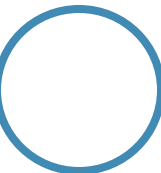
ONLINE ONLY LEARNING

Teachers and students will run their normal schedule Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday.

- Must login by 8:15 am.
- Students will go to their scheduled classes via a TEAMS meeting link in the specials' teachers classroom page.
- Specials will join the TEAMS meeting to provide live instruction.
- Hour long break for lunch & recess. This may be divided into two half hour sessions.
- Students then return to their afternoon classes via TEAMS.
- Wednesdays students will login for attendance then work asynchronously/ small groups.

Students will utilize their Chromebook and Canvas to log into their homeroom for live instruction.

Live instruction will provide for independent work breaks where students will be able to turn off camera and mic for independent practice.





COMPARING HYBRID & ONLINE



HYBRID

Attendance is taken via attendance question and work completion

- Students must respond to the question/ complete the required amount of work to be present for the day

Some students attend in-person; some students are online

Mostly asynchronous

Students bring devices to school daily

ONLINE

Attendance is taken via morning meeting in homeroom

- Students must be logged into their homeroom at 8:15 am
- Will be marked absent after 8:25 am
- Students must be present at their live sessions throughout the day

All students attend online

Mostly synchronous





Posting Assignments and Tasks

Students work independently



Mini-Lessons

Students watch pre-recorded videos and complete associated assignments



Live Small Group or 1:1 Instruction

Students participate in small group lesson with direct feedback or interaction with teacher the assignments go along with lesson



Live Lesson

Lessons with online only students that mirror the instruction in-person students receive



Livestreaming Classrooms

Teachers provide instruction to in-person and online students at the same time

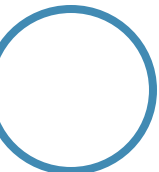


ASYNCHRONOUS VS SYNCHRONOUS LEARNING



Teachers will choose the most appropriate model for instruction

- Online- a blend of both synchronous and asynchronous learning with the focus being on synchronous instruction and independent practice
- Hybrid- in person instruction and online asynchronous instruction blended with opportunities for synchronous small group/ individual remediation or enrichment





HOW DO I KNOW THE LEARNING MODEL?



Families will be notified via Skylert messages when a school has to switch to the online model.

- Due to Department of Education mandates, the switch to online may be sudden

After the required period of closure is over, students will revert back to their previous chosen hybrid learning model.

- Either go back to in-person or fully online.
 - In-person K-2 will be 4 days a week with 1 online day.
 - In-person 3-5 will be 2 days a week with 3 online days.

The Brentwood Borough School District will be fully online from January 4 until January 29, 2021.

Hybrid instruction is scheduled to resume on February 1, 2021.
