

# LIBERTY-BENTON RECEIVES HIGH MARKS ON STATE REPORT CARD

Ohio's School Report Cards were issued in mid-September, and Liberty-Benton received 24 of 25 possible stars, ranking 13th in the state out of 607 districts!

This is the first time in two years that report cards have been issued as a result of the pandemic, and they come with a new rating system. Replacing the traditional letter grade is a five-star rating, with one being the lowest (needs support) and five being the highest (significantly exceeds). State report cards are intended to give parents/guardians, community members, educators and policymakers information about how districts are performing.

- Achievement
- Progress
- Gap Closing
- Graduation
- Early Literacy

Next year, the report card will also rate districts on Readiness, which looks at how well students are prepared for future opportunities, whether training in a technical field or preparing for work or college.



Report cards are just one measure of success for school districts, but this demonstrates Liberty-Benton's commitment to being a top district in Northwest Ohio and the state. Congratulations to our staff and students, and thank you to our community for your continued support.

### TREASURER'S UPDATE



They say it takes a village to raise a single child. Multiply this by 1,000, and it takes a strong community to educate and prepare a district full of students for their future.

Thankfully, Liberty-Benton is such a district. In addition to our all-new PK-8 building and renovations to our high school, the district has several construction projects underway or recently completed that are part of our master facilities plan.

The tradition of meeting our district's growing educational needs dates back to 1994 when voters passed an \$8.2 million, 7.6 mill levy to fund the construction of a new high school on County Road 9. From these humble beginnings, Liberty-Benton has grown substantially in both variety of programming and the number of students and families served.

In May of 2019, the community supported the district once again by approving a \$25.6 million bond. In combination with funds received from the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission, the district was able to move forward with the construction of the new PK-8 building, renovate the existing high school, and construct an 800-seat auditorium. To date, \$14.3 million in local dollars and \$15 million in state dollars have gone toward these construction projects.

Other projects have included the installation of a new turf field and track, improvements to the baseball field, seating, and netting, a new athletic facility entry, and an all-new Field House. The cost to the district of the turf field and track was \$1.4 million and was funded locally from funds set aside for permanent improvements. The baseball field and

associated improvements were paid for with a generous gift from the Athletic Boosters and private funding collected by the Baseball Diamond Club. These renovations are valued at \$375,000. The cost of the new athletic facility entryway was \$451,000, also paid for with local funds set aside for permanent improvements. Last, our Field House, which is valued at \$1.6 million, was constructed without the use of any taxpayer dollars. We are so thankful for our Athletic Boosters, who contributed 94.4% of the cost. The district committed approximately \$92,000 to the project as a result of Liberty-Benton being named the beneficiary of the Janet Light-Hilty-Basinger Charitable Trust.

All of this shows the district and community's commitment to our collective future. Thank you for being our – and more importantly – our students, village.

### HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS ENJOYING UPDATED LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

After months of anticipation, Liberty-Benton High School students returned for the 2022-2023 school year to a new and improved building.

This past summer, the high school underwent a complete transformation, including:

- · Converting the library into additional classrooms
- Modifying the cafetorium to include learning and collaboration spaces
- · Relocating the Choir room and Computer Lab
- · Adding air conditioning to the gymnasium

The project was funded by the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission through the Rebuilding Ohio Schools Program and the bond issue passed by the community on May 7, 2019. The state's share of the cost is 57% while 43% is being covered by local dollars.

We are so excited about the enhanced opportunities for learning and collaboration this newly renovated space provides our students.



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
