TREASURER'S UPDATE FREE MEALS GOING AWAY IN 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR



In March 2020 when COVID-19 began spreading across the U.S., economic uncertainty was faced by millions of families. With the help of Congressional funding, the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) began offering all students breakfast and lunch, at

no charge. These waivers are set to expire June 30, 2022, and Liberty-Benton students are expected to return next school year (2022-2023) to pre-pandemic operations.

To continue to receive the free and reduced cost meals, we encourage our families to apply for free/reduced meals for the 2022-2023 school year. Applications are available at libertybenton.org by clicking on District, then District Forms or simply by visiting **www.payschoolscentral.com**. There is no cost for families to register and apply online. Hard copies will also be available at each school building when the school year begins.

Breakfast and lunch prices for the 2022/2023 school year are as follows:

- Elementary, Middle School, High School Breakfast: \$1.40
- Reduced Breakfast: \$.30
- Elementary K-5 Lunch: \$2.70
- Middle School 6-8 Lunch: \$2.75
- High School 9-12 Lunch: \$2.80
- Reduced Lunch: \$0.40


