

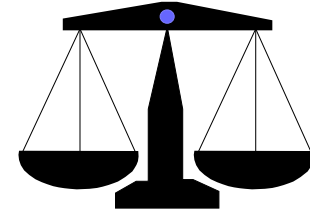

College Credit Plus



- CCP replaced Ohio's Post-Secondary Enrollment Options program (PSEOP) and all alternative dual enrollment programs previously governed by Ohio Revised Code Chapter 3365.
- Gov. Kasich signed House Bill 487 into law on June 16, 2014.
- CCP program became operational 2015/16 school year.

College Credit Plus Participation



- All public districts (high schools) and public institutions of higher education (IHE) **must** allow college-ready students, grades 7-12, who qualify for college admission to participate.
- All nonpublic postsecondary schools **may** participate.
- Each participating IHE must **consistently** apply its established admission standards and prior to making a final admission decision, the IHE shall evaluate the student against one of the standards identified in the "**Uniform Statewide Standards for Remediation-Free Status.**"

Remediation Free

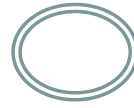

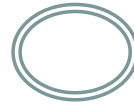

College Credit Plus Participation



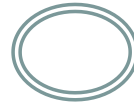
- Students must be enrolled in grades 7-12
- High Schools must offer a CCP information meeting for students and parents.
- Sign & return the “*Intent to Participate*”, “*LBHS Mandated Counseling*”, and “*LBHS Textbook*” by April 1st
- File a CCP application with interested IHE
- Submit transcript to IHE
- Register and successfully complete ACT, SAT, or ACCUPLACER
- Attend a CCP registration session for courses taken directly at the IHE

Advantages of CCP



- Chance to experience college-level work and college life prior to graduation
- Opportunity to take courses not offered at high school
- Receive both high school and college credits at **no cost** to the family

College Credits & Carnegie Units (HS)

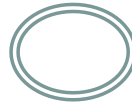


Conversion

<u>college</u>	<u>high school</u>
1 semester credit	.33 credit
2 semester credits	.66 credit
3 or more credits	1 credit

- Total college semester credits cannot exceed 30 per academic year.
- High school credits are multiplied by 3 then subtracted from 30 to determine available college hours.

Conversion Example



Student A : takes 4 credits at LBHS

$$4 \times 3 = 12$$

$$30 - 12 = 18$$

This student could take 18 semester hours at the college.

Student B: takes 7 credits at LBHS

$$7 \times 3 = 21$$

$$30 - 21 = 9$$

This student could take 9 semester hours at the college.

Student C: takes 6.5 credits at LBHS

$$6.5 \times 3 = 19.5$$

$$30 - 19.5 = 10.5$$

This student could take 10 hours at the college. (there is no 1/2 in college)

What Courses can be Taken



- Courses can satisfy high school graduation requirements
 - School Counselor can help students understand requirements and course substitutions
 - Schools might have additional requirements in addition to the state minimum
- College advisors will help students know which courses they can take, based on:
 - Assessment scores
 - Course prerequisites
 - Level I or Level II – depending on the number of credit hours a student has already completed

What Courses can be Taken



- Students must complete their First 15 credits in Level I courses, which include:
 - Transferable courses.
 - Courses in IT, Computer Science, Anatomy & Physiology, foreign language.
 - Courses that are part of a technical certificate.
 - Courses that are part of a 15- or 30-credit pathway.
 - Courses in study skills, academic or career success.
- Colleges must post their Level I courses
- Once a student completes the First 15 credit hours in Level I, then he or she may move to Level II courses assuming they are allowable college courses for which a student meets the prerequisites.

What Courses can NOT be Taken



- Non-allowable courses include:
 - A private course with one-on-one instruction
 - Courses with high fees
 - Study abroad courses
 - Physical education courses
 - Pass/Fail graded courses
 - Remedial courses
 - Religious courses.

Possible Concerns



Transportation

Student/Guardian is responsible for transport and any parking fees
2 hour delays do not exist at the college level

Calendar

Vacation days at the high school & IHE school may not be the same
Attendance is the student's responsibility

High School Extra-Curricular Activities

Schedules may not align to allow participation in all activities

Social Aspect

High school students will face new challenges emotionally and socially

Possible Concerns



Qualifying for Graduation

Failure to successfully complete a CCP course may result in delay of graduation

Parental Access and FERPA-CCP

Students are treated as adults and they own their education records once they set foot on a college campus

No access to Schoology

Fees

Financial obligations become the student/guardian responsibility unless the student is identified as being economically disadvantaged in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code 3365.09

- Late withdrawal from the class
- Student does not receive a passing grade

Poor Performance

College Credit Plus Probation

- Placed on Probation if:
 - Earns a 2.0 GPA or less in CCP course
 - Withdraws from 2 or more courses in an academic term
- While on CCP Probation, the student:
 - May *only* enroll in one College Credit Plus course for one college term (semester or quarter).
 - May not enroll in the college course in the same subject in which student previously earned D or F or received no credit.

Poor Performance

College Credit Plus Dismissal

- If students on CCP probation does not increase their College Credit Plus GPA to a 2.0 or above during the probation term, they will be placed on CCP Dismissal
- While on CCP Dismissal, students may not enroll in any College Credit Plus courses.
- This will NOT effect the student applying for regular college admission to a IHE.

Withdrawal from CCP

- Student is responsible to file withdrawal forms with IHE.
- Student is responsible for all financial obligations from late withdrawal.
- Withdrawal after two weeks into the term will result in a WF appearing on high school transcript. This will count as an F on high school transcript and the cost of the course will be billed to the student. Ohio Revised Code 3365.09
- Student must meet with high school counselor to create new schedule.



- CCP application online - Deadline: April 15, 2021
- 3.0 overall GPA
- Books – MUST check with LBHS **prior** to getting book
 - BGSU no longer has a bookstore online ordering only.
 - Books MUST be returned at end of course.
- High School students must attend CCP orientation in May. After orientation, students may schedule, this is before BGSU students.



- CCP application – Deadline: June 1, 2021
- 2.5 overall GPA.
- Test Scores: due to UF by June 1, 2021
- Books are loaned ~ MUST be returned.
- High School students schedule after UF students.



- Application – one time Deadline: August 23, 2021
- Course requirements and prerequisites must be followed.
- Books – MUST check with LBHS **prior** to getting from bookstore
 - MUST be returned to LBHS at end of course.
- Schedule classes same as all Owens' students
- Students need to participate in an Owens orientation yearly.



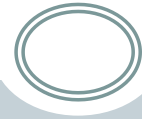
- Application – one time Deadline: April 1, 2021
- Course requirements and prerequisites must be followed.
- Books – MUST check with LBHS **prior** to getting from bookstore
 - MUST be returned to LBHS at end of course.
- High School students schedule with their CCP advisor one week **before** Rhodes State students.
- Students need to participate in Rhodes State CCP first year orientation.

CCP at L-B



- Classes are taught here at L-B by L-B teachers who are college/university adjunct professors.
- Application is made to the university through L-B Guidance Office and acceptance is completely up to college/university.
- College/university must follow the "**Uniform Statewide Standards for Remediation-Free Status**" for determining acceptance.

TAG vs. OTM



- **TAG** ~ Transfer Assurance Guarantee
Courses apply to the College Major Requirements.
 - **OTM** ~ Ohio Transfer Module
Courses must transfer in that core discipline.
- No designation ~ Credit must transfer, but may be a pure elective.

Transferability vs. Applicability



Transferability: If you earn a C or higher on a college course it will **transfer** to another college.

Applicability: The course is the **equivalent** to the course needed in the Program of Study at the college you choose to pursuing it at.
