## **POWER4SCHOOLS' AGREEMENT**

RESOLUTION TO ENDORSE THE FAIR SCHOOL FUNDING PLAN, AS INTRODUCED IN THE SENATE COMPANION BILL TO SUBSTITUTE H.B. 305, AND TO ENCOURAGE THE 133RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO EXPEDITE THE PASSAGE OF THE BILL

Mr. Csehi made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Miller to approve a resolution to endorse the Fair School Funding Plan, as introduced in the Senate companion bill to substitute H.B.305, and to encourage the 133rd General Assembly to expedite the passage of the bill.

# DISCUSSION OF FUTURE INSTRUCTIONAL PLAN

Superintendent Hal Gregory discussed instructional plan for k-12 in light of recent recommendation by the Lucas County Board of Health. Discussion centered on trying to improve services to students as we adjust to remote/online learning several board members expressed concerns about their children being online for 8 hours straight without any breaks. Board member Keith Kennedy questioned whether we could challenge the County Board of Health shutting down all sports. His argument was that this will simply push students into the non-academic clubs/programs that are not being handled as safely as school sporting programs.

OCS will be remote from November 30, 2020 through January 11, 2021. Sports will no longer practice or have contests effective December 4, 2020 through January 11, 2021 as recommended by the Lucas County Health Board.
