STAFF/COMMUNITY RECOGNITION/PRESENTATION Gifted Coordinator, Tammy Hughes, recognized students Kendal Rivera and Kylee Tabler for their College Board National Recognitions.		
Bay Park employees: Dr. Bruce Barnett, MD; and Paula Grieb, DNP,RN made a presentation to the Board of Education on what they were seeing first hand in their medical practices and within the Bay Park System as it relates to Covid 19 Pandemic. Along with their recommendations to best keep students in school learning. Bay Park President, Thad Wadsworth, introduced his team and showed his support for the community and schools.		
PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AT BOARD MEETINGS Ruth Price, 5255 Seaman Road, spoke to board on a number of issues: costs of property taxes for sr. citizens, she was one of the mask protestors in front of building and believe masks should be a choice, not a requirement.		
Eric Bench, 353 S. Decant Road, spoke to disagree with student mask requirement. He commented that more kids have died in car accidents than from Covid19.		
William Fred Lewis, 5120 Brown Rd., candidate for School Board. Students he works with through his church report being scared by all the mask mandates. He wasn't really questioning the need for masks but questioned the hypocrisy of not needing them at football games. He ultimately believes it is the parents decision whether masks are necessary for their children but the hypocrisy is what he objects to the most.		

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Eric Rice, 231 N. Teachout, Curtice, Oh., cited an article stating that "germ theory" which teaches that micro-organisms spread disease is flawed theory. And is being used to create fear of something that essentially does not exist.

Greg Bonnell, 5401 Pickle Rd., as a retired educator with 40 years of experience, he believes masks are a huge hinderance to communication for our teachers and students. No viable reason to wear masks at this time, children are not as impacted by Covid as older adults and are more likely to get struck by lightning than have a serious reaction to Covid. Why are the schools masking our kids?

Robin Burnette, 446 S. Lallendorf, questioned why we are requiring masks on students, was there a COVID breakout in our schools? There is no reason for students to be forced to wear masks. She also objects to any form of teaching "Critical Race Theory".

Board President, Carol Molnar spoke up that Oregon follows Ohio Curriculum, which does not include CRT.

Kate Lankey, not an Oregon resident, spoke up that it is the rights of parents to choose if their children should be wearing a mask. People are not going to continue to stand for this type of over reach by Boards of Education.

Vivian Stuller, 11935 Rachel Road, Oregon City Schools employee and resident. Her entire family is vaccinated and all wear masks happily. The kids want to be in school and are willing to keep masks on if that is what keeps them in school. The kids are not having a problem with this.

Hal Gregory, OCS Superintendent, thanked individuals for taking time to speak with the Board. He acknowledged that he was just doing his best to keep as many students in the school buildings as possible. Obviously he cannot keep everyone happy, but keeping kids in schools was his entire agenda. That is what is best for kids.
