# Dr. Terry W. Worrell, Superintendent

# Opening

Chairman Lamb called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

Following a moment of silence, Hannah Charles, Erin Eames, and Dolly Gladden, North Asheboro Middle School students, led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Board unanimously approved the meeting agenda.

North Asheboro Middle School principal, Candace Call, and Mr. Matt Kidd, instructor and sponsor, highlighted the school's FFA organization.

Dr. Terry Worrell recognized Candace Call, North Asheboro Middle School principal, who was elected by her peers as the Asheboro City Schools Principal of the Year.

Dr. Terry Worrell announced that Asheboro City Schools has been recognized by State Superintendent Mark Johnson as one of the Top Ten School Districts in North Carolina with a graduation rate of 92.7% for 2017-2018.
