

Distinguished Studies Award

- Four Units of Science

- One Unit of Fine Arts

Platinum Seal Award

- Must earn minimum 27 units
- Complete 5 elective units related to Career Cluster

- \$6,700 per year
- GPA 3.5 or higher
- Top 6% of the class at the end of the 10th, 11th or 12th grade
- SAT score 1200 – ACT score 27

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Life Scholarship

4-yr College/University

- \$5,000 per year
- Eligibility Requirements must be 2 of the 3
 - 3.0 GPA
 - Graduate top 30% of class
 - SAT score 1100 / ACT score 24

2-yr College / Technical College

- Tuition
- Eligibility Requirements
 - 3.0 GPA

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Hope Scholarship

- \$2,800
- GPA 3.0
- Freshman year only at a 4-year college/university in South Carolina
