Classes are held Monday-Thursday from 8:45 a.m. - 2:15 p.m.

- Morning classes consist of individualized 1:1 and small group instruction (maximum of six preschoolers with intensive needs). Instruction focuses on developing foundational academic, functional and language skills.
- Children eat packed lunches in the classroom with time for peer socialization.
- Afternoon classes focus on age appropriate structured play, social skills and group interaction with peers.

The Summit Preschool is licensed by the State of Ohio. State inspection reports of the Summit County Preschool are available for viewing through the supervisor or designee.



What is the First Start Preschool Program?

The Summit ESC First Start Preschool program is designed to meet the needs of preschool-aged children requiring concentration on functional academics, social-emotional skills, communication and behavioral intervention. Placement of students in the intensive needs classroom is determined on a case-by-case basis. Decisions are made according to data from evaluations, observations and behavioral interventions, as well as input from parents, residential school districts and the First Start program staff.
